Dear friends, grace to you and peace from God our Father and our Lord Jesus who fully reveals himself to us through his journey to the cross and the season of Lent with us. Amen.

Faith stories. Throughout the church year, we hear faith stories that are given in great detail as Jesus walked with whoever he encountered. It is through these faith stories, the early church shaped its worship structure. Advent became a time of preparation to celebrate the birth of our Lord. It included the prophecies of the birth of the Messiah. This became fulfilled in the birth of Jesus of Nazareth. The Christmas season describes the birth of our Lord in great detail through the faith stories of Joseph and Mary and the shepherds. The Epiphany season told the faith story of the Wise Men who came to worship the new born King. Along the journey during Epiphany, the faith stories of how Jesus revealed who God is, is shown through his teaching and his signs / miracles.

Then as we moved from Epiphany to our Lenten season a couple of weeks ago, we recognize the connection between the birth of our Lord and the passion of Lent and Holy Week. Together, Epiphany and now Lent help us to understand and connect the meaning of the manger, the cross and the empty tomb. The faith stories help us focus within ourselves and understand the meaning of our faith. These faith stories are bridge builders. They are stories of forgiveness, healing, calling, renewal and hope

Now in our Lenten journey, this bridge specifically prepares us as we focus on the events of Holy Week. Through these faith stories that we hear on Sunday morning and during our mid-week Lenten services, we may recognize and know the saving grace of our God in all of the above. Together we will hear the story of the parable of the Lost Son and the story of Zacchaeus for example and know they are a prelude to the events of Holy Week itself. That is the intent of the faith stories in our gospels.





In the life and ministry of Jesus, we consider this an interim period of transition. Jesus moves from one setting to another. Each movement is building upon the other with intensity. All of his parables and his healings point to the cross. Jesus knew his sole purpose was the journey to the cross. He knew this was his Father's will and he knew in this sacrificial act, God's people, you and I, would receive the gift of forgiveness and life. Through our Lord Jesus, you and I are reconciled with God in a divine relationship which cannot be broken. That is God's promise secured for us via the cross of our Lord. In the latter months of his ministry, Jesus prepared himself for that final act of ministry. In doing so, he prepared his disciples as well. In the same way, it becomes our Lenten story and our journey.

Remember our Lenten journey is a step-bystep process of moving forward with our Lord to the cross. The events we focus upon, share with us specific stories which prepare us for the events of Holy Week. As we hear those stories, we are able to walk with the crowds in final three months of Jesus' ministry and with him in his Triumphal Journey into Jerusalem. It is then through Holy Week that we walk the solemn walk with him through the narrow streets of Jerusalem to Calvary. It is here where these recorded events reach its climax in the events on Good Friday and in the Easter stories of resurrected life. Our focus during this Lenten Season, takes us back to the biblical account of Jesus' life. Yet at the same time, it helps us in our present journey, in which prepares each day for the journey to come. We pray that the Spirit of our Lord so prepare us as we journey to the cross with our Lord and rejoice in the victory of salvation which is offered on Easter morning.

Circle of Faith Parish Council Minutes February 5, 2013

Meeting was called to order at Trinity Lutheran at 7:10 pm by President Steve Williamson. Members present: Merle Burmeister, Marilyn Cheever, Jody Franck, Jon Helvig, Joel Rabbe, Kirsten Rabbe, Jon Saxen, Liz Stahl, and Steve Williamson. Pr. Giese led us in devotions.

Kirsten read the Secretary's report from our January 13, 2013 meeting. Motion by Jon Saxen, second by Jon Helvig, to approve the report as read. Motion Approved.

Joe reviewed the current treasury situation. There will be deposits beginning in February, as we are still waiting on 2 checks. Joe will begin cutoffs in the end of February. Waiting on two checks. Both the Pastor and Parish Administrator will be paid on the 15th of each month. Motion by Jody Franck, second by Liz Stahl, to approve report as discussed. Motion passed.

OLD BUSINESS

Call Committee Update

An update from the Call Committee was given by Jody Franck. Interviews are progressing.

Offering Envelopes

An offering envelope design was approved. These envelopes will be printed in the church office, and will be available in all three churches. These will offer visiting COF members at other COF congregations the chance to put their offering in the plate, and get it to their home congregation. Alternatively, they can be used as regular offering envelopes, if a congregation desires.

Parish Administrator Position Update

Lisa Wohlhuter is staffing the office Monday thru Friday from 9 am to 1 pm. Her employment contract is signed, and on file in the Parish Office. Discussion on coverage when Lisa is on vacation. Finance Committee is still working on this.

Parish Office Equipment and Systems

Office equipment is being ordered. We will be adding a second phone line and faster internet (more band width) to the office. Circle of Faith will pay 50% and Trinity will pay 50%, at a net savings to Trinity.

NEW BUSINESS

Congregational Runners

A volunteer system of runners will be established. Volunteers for this duty will be solicited by a note in the Newsletter and bulletins. Lisa will coordinate the schedule for the runners. Need to set up a mail box at St. Peter and Waverly for information that needs to get to the office.

Parish Insurancé

Workman's Comp for Circle of Faith Parish is in place. Circle of Faith is being added as an "additional insured" on each church's existing policy (business owner policy). Finance Committee is working to get each congregation's policy set with the same minimum for liability (\$1,000,000). Short term goal – get each congregation covered at the same level. Long term goal – evaluate if there is a benefit for having one carrier for all three congregations and Circle of Faith. Pr. Giese suggested checking into adding Sexual Misconduct coverage on our policy. Jon noted that sometimes that requires training by the Pastors and staff. Waverly and St. Peter currently have this coverage.

Parish Newsletter

- -Kirsten passed out a synopsis of what was included in past Parish Newsletters for our congregations. A checklist combining the contents of both was presented and discussed.
- -We will offer a chance to "Name the Parish Newsletter" by announcing it in our bulletins, and asking anyone with a suggestion to call the Parish Office by March 1st. Decision will be made by the Parish Council at March Meeting.

Joint Parish and Congregational Council Meetings

In conjunction with our Quarterly Circle of Faith Meetings, we will ask our congregations to have their meetings for that month on the same evening at Trinity in Welcome. The Parish Council will meet at 7:00 pm, and the Congregational Councils at 8:00 pm. This allows the pastor to be at all four meetings for a time. We will offer Joint devotions. These meetings will be held on the first Mondays of February, May, August, and November. Steve will alert Congregational Presidents of this request.

Standing Committees

The formation of Standing Committees was discussed. Standing Committees initially will be: Education and Youth, Worship, Communications, and Finance. Eventually, we will add Mission & Outreach and New Congregations. A discussion about whether we have enough people to man these committees, followed

by suggestions of how to use these to save time rather than create more positions, by combining with systems already in place. Parish Council members to work with Standing Committees:

. Communications – Kirsten Rabbe . Finance – Jon Saxen, Jody Franck, Joe Rabbe

Who's Who in Our Congregations

A form was passed out to each congregation, asked them to fill in information, get to Lisa.

Membership Information to be Computerized

Lisa will work with congregational presidents to gather and understand each congregation's information. **Website**

Brief discussion of website content, who to get information from for each congregation. **Other items**

- -Discussed policy for communicating to congregations in the case of weather related cancellations. Communications Committee will investigate this.
- -A discussion about Bible Camp for Confirmation 8th graders was held. This topic was referred to Youth and Education Committee, with an eye toward ultimately developing a Parish wide policy, whereby each congregation would support their confirmands to the same dollar amount. This will take some time. The Council is mindful of its previous promises to the congregations, that the Parish would provide basic pastoral services and office support. Asking the congregations to change that could risk a loss of credibility. However, if the policy is developed simultaneously in all three congregations, it could be worked into the budget down the road.
- -Pastor offered, with the support of the Parish, to have the Parish Administrator mail copies of his sermon, along with a bulletin to each parish shut-in. General agreement this is part of the ministry of Circle of Faith Parish. The Parish will cover the cost of copying and postage.
- -Discussion was held on distribution of cash offerings at Lenten Services. Each host church will make the decision of where their "loose change" offerings will be designated.
- -Due to March conflicts, Steve and Jon will do research on a meeting date for March, and will have Lisa let everyone know two weeks prior to the next meeting.

- --Phil brought up a possible fund raiser for the youth as well as a summer project of washing the outside of the church siding.
- --Installation Sunday will be Feb. 24th. All new board members are invited to attend.
- --The Parish Finance Committee would like to look over each church's individual insurance policies. Eileen moved and Phil seconded to allow them to review ours. Motion carried.


