



## FAREWELL and GOD'S PEACE

Dear Members of Circle of Faith Parish, grace to you and peace from God our Father and our Lord Jesus the Christ. Amen.

First of all, may I offer congratulations to you, Circle of Faith Parish, as you issue a Letter of Call to Pastor Anthony Christoffels. This Letter of Call to your new pastor symbolically begins your new journey in ministry. It symbolizes a journey that began in September of 2010, when members of area churches came to Waverly to talk about the possibilities of forming a new parish. As I recall that meeting, there was a lively conversation about all the opportunities that may come from such a venture. Eight congregations agreed that evening to begin that dream. In August 2012, three of the congregations voted in favor of this joint venture. Through this vote, a new parish was born and a short time later was given the name "Circle of Faith Parish".

There are seven steps identified with the ELCA call process. This includes the interim ministry, congregational study, call committee interviewing candidates and then the congregation voting on a candidate for ministry. After the vote and acceptance of the Letter of Call by the candidate, the congregation moves into the final step of the interim time. My friends, you have now entered into the final phase. In the ensuing weeks, you will be preparing to receive Pastor Christoffels and his family as your first Lead Pastor of Circle of Faith Parish. We thank Carl Rabbe for being with us this summer. He will assist our congregations as we begin our new ministry. The dreams that began nearly three years ago (or perhaps before that) have now become a reality. Together, we give thanks to God.

Paul writes in his Letter to the Philippians in chapter 1, *"I thank my God every time I remember you. In all my prayers for all of you, I always pray with joy because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now, being confident of this, that he who began the good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus"*.

These words of Paul express the gratitude of partnership in ministry. In a farewell statement, I can think of nothing less. To our members of Waverly: from the beginning of the interim period in August 2010 until now, you have opened the doors of your parish for me. To our members of Trinity, it has been a pleasure to return and share in ministry with you. To our members of St. Peter, it was an opportunity to be in your midst and become a part of your faith community. Through you, now Circle of Faith Parish, I have once again received a new appreciation of yet another interim experience, this time with you as the newest cluster in our Southwestern Minnesota Synod.

These words of Paul express in gratitude with many who shared their faith stories as we journeyed through the cluster conversations. Each of our congregations shared their dreams of ministry and these dreams became a part of our parish study. I was intrigued as I listened to the stories unfold. Then as ministry ensued, the stories from young and old alike unfolded in our respective churches, in the assisted living community and nursing homes, and in your homes. Your stories, whether they were from life long members or members who transferred in and are relatively young in membership, reflect the message of God's gift of community. As I have participated in ministry with you, I experienced the traditions of ministry which is a testimony to the rich history of each congregation. That is one of the blessings that I have received from you and will take with me as I continue my journey in interim ministry. I have truly felt your embrace as your interim pastor. I commend you for the parish council leadership and each congregational council member among you and for members who participate in your various ministries, for your faithfulness, for your outreach within the community and your faithfulness to the greater church. I give thanks to God for your ministry and give him the glory.

Now shortly you will begin your new chapter of ministry with Pastor Anthony Christoffels and his family. This marks a new journey of ministry in the life of Circle of Faith Parish. The foundations have been laid with the cornerstone of faith in our Lord Jesus. Indeed it is an exciting time for ministry and all its possibilities that God has in store for you.

Please be assured that Mary and I will remember you in our prayers as you minister here in the Circle of Faith Parish and in each community. I also ask for your prayers for my next interim. (Yet to be determined.) I will let you know where and when that happens. Thank you for the opportunity to be your partner in ministry.

## A Seminarian's Letters Home --- May 2013



To the membership of Circle of Faith Parish:

Greetings to you all from back in Trimont! It's been a long, complicated, intriguing journey through my seminary years. Thank you for accompanying me through these years with your thoughts and prayers, and through reading these letters. I'm looking forward to being with you for the summer months as we transition into a new world of mission and ministry together.

On June 25, the church celebrates the birth of John the Baptist, the forerunner of the Messiah, the man whom Jesus would call the greatest prophet. I often wonder if John really knew, once he grew up and was out in the wilderness, what he was announcing. Did he know who or what would follow him, or what the Messiah would go on to do? I doubt it. He couldn't have. But he did know that whatever came would be good news. Whatever came would proclaim that the kingdom of God had come near.

As I write this letter, it's still May. Very soon, we will vote on calling a new lead pastor. I don't know what will happen in that vote, nor in the days ahead when our new pastor comes. But I do know that this is a great thing. I know that this is the end of a long and complicated process, and we are now able to launch into an amazing new world as Circle of Faith. I know that God has brought us here, will go with us on this journey, and is leading us into a fantastic place, full of promise and potential.

Stepping out into this summer of great change and hope, let us pray for God's blessing, using these words:

*O God, you have called your servants to ventures of which we cannot see the ending, by paths as yet untrodden, through perils unknown. 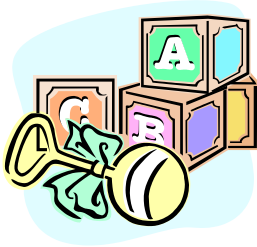

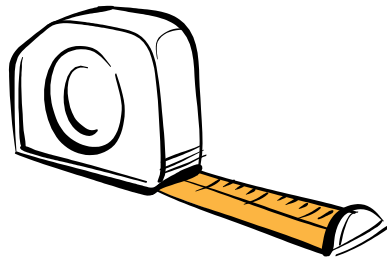
