Committee reports: none

Old business/New business: The Pay periods for church staff are being proposed to be at the end of each month instead of 2 weeks later. Presently organists have been paid by service rather than once a month. Pastors will log who has been playing at which church each Sunday. Subs will still be paid by service. Trinity Council January 10, 2017

Members present were Henry Borchardt, John Borchardt, Velma Schaal, Becky Detert, Lonnie Moffitt, Pastor Anthony and Pastor Eric. Henry called the meeting to order. Velma made a motion, seconded by Lonnie to approve the agenda. Motion carried.

Pastor Eric gave devotions.

<u>Pastor's Report:</u> Pastor Eric said that he has Continuing Ed in February regarding the Old Testament and how it relates to us today and the other discussion will be on the Reformation. Both Pastors will be going to continuing ed in March relating to rural and small town ministries. There have been several people hospitalized in Rochester so Pastor Eric has been going to Rochester to visit them on his way down to Welcome. Pastor Anthony mentioned the Lily grant again which is a \$250,000 grant to help seminary students with their student loans. The \$250,000 must be matched by the congregations in the synod for it to all be disbursed. There are a couple of lock ins coming up at Waverly. The one for the 7th and 8th graders will be January 13th and the one for the 9th-12th graders will be January 20th. Chaperones are needed.

The Secretary, Treasurer and Financial Secretary reports were gone over. Motion was made by Becky and seconded by Velma to approve the reports. Motion carried. The budgets for Trinity and the Parish Council were gone over. Benevolence spending was discussed and Velma made a motion, John seconded to give \$500 to the SW Synod, \$250 to the Lily grant and \$250 to the Salvation Army.

There were no reports from the Faith Formation, Caring Ministries and Property Committees.

Old Business:

Council member positions - Positions needing to be filled are two on the Property Committee – Larry Philipps has volunteered to fill one of them leaving one position open. Parish Council had one position open and Deb Philipps has offered to remain on as a member, one to two delegates are needed for the Synod Assembly and there are all four positions open on the Faith Formation committee. Henry has offered to remain as president, Becky as treasurer and Jean as Financial Secretary. The Caring Ministries committee had two openings and Bob and Lonnie Moffitt have agreed to remain on that committee.

New Business:

Annual Meeting Agenda: Old Business – Parish Directory will hopefully be done by the end of February.

New Business: Parish Agreement additions and Trinity's future-discussion- where are we at now and what is our future.

Habitat for Humanity is looking for volunteers to help on a house in Fairmont. Henry is getting more information on what needs to be done.

The youth will be serving a meal before the Lenten services. March 1 and March 22 will be the two services at Trinity.

Velma made a motion with a second from Becky to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried. We closed with the Lord's Prayer.

NEW BUSINESS

Parish Agreement Additions needed to be voted on were: Article VIII 14 -If a congregation cannot find a replacement for an outgoing parish council member, the congregation at their regularly called annual meeting may suspend the term limits for one year by a 2/3 majority vote.

Article VIII 15

If a parish council member is not able to attend a meeting, and a quorum would not be possible without their presence, then the parish council member may vote by proxy via phone. Voice and vote must be verbal.

Motion by Bob Moffitt, Seconded by Jon Saxen to approve additions. Motion carried.

All three churches must approve these to add them to the agreement

Summer worship schedule was discussed and it was decided Trinity would like to continue with one month in June, July or August to hold services on Wednesday night and the other two months start at 8:30. This will be taken back to the Parish Council.

The future of Trinity was discussed. There was discussion on how to get people to come back to the church. We have 451 baptized members and 360 confirmed members and our average Sunday attendance is 44. Having lay people help out with visits to members that are around but don't attend was discussed. Are we going to throw in the towel or fight???? All ideas to bring more people to church are welcome.

Waverly is now the biggest church in attendance with an average of 54 members, Trinity with 44 and St. Peter with 32 at services.

Motion to adjourn was made by Bob Moffitt with a second from Bob Swanson. Motion carried.

Cliff presented the 2017 proposed congregational annual budget of \$93,766. After some discussion a motion by Bob Olson and seconded by Deanne Gaalswyk to adopt the 2017 budget. Motion carried.

Pastor Anthony presented the 2017 Circle of Faith budget of \$155,773.00. A motion by Jon Helvig and seconded by Jeff Lueth to accept the budget as presented. Motion carried

<u>Pastor's report:</u> The Honeywell message system is being updated with members' new phone numbers. Pastor reminded the members of the many upcoming church events. The youth are planning a trip to the Black Hills the end of July. The meals before the Lenten services and Ash Wednesday will be fundraisers for the youth trip. Pastor Anthony will help lead a trip to Germany in July 2018. If you are interested in this trip contact Pastor Anthony. Deposit money is due in the spring.

Old Business: The Parish directory is close to printing stage. The office personnel is in the process of final proof reading.

Nancy Nordstrom presented the slate of officers and committees for 2017 as printed with the addition of Gwen Matz for worship committee. A motion by Brad Sherman and seconded by Karen Helvig accept the 2017 nominations. Motion carried.

<u>New Business:</u> The Parish Agreement additions to Article VIII 14 and Article VIII 15 were printed and presented by the President. A motion by Deanne Gaalswyk and second by Jon Helvig to accept the changes as printed. Motion carried.

Endowment Fund: The initial investment for the Endowment Fund was sent in and an account was established December 28th the amount invested was \$53,000 Tim Peterson will leave a binder at the church office with information about the fund. Amy Bigot from the ELCA endowment plans to be at Waverly April 2nd. She will plan to meet before church for anyone that would want information about endowment funds. More information to come as we get closer to the date.

Pastor asked how members like the summer worship schedule. Members agreed they like the schedule. It was decided to use the same schedule as last year for the three churches.

Jeff Lueth presented an update from the Parish council about our member congregations. Karen Helvig reminded us we are all family. She presented a poster with words that say how the three congregations are alike and different.

"God Be With You 'Till We Meet Again" was written by Jeremiah Rankin, pastor of Washington First Congregational Church and president of Howard University. He said he wrote it after discovering that 'Goodbye' was merely a contraction of "God Be With You". One outstanding story about the power of this hymn is so moving that it must be shared with you:

"It was September 10, 1945. Darlene Deibler was liberated from Jap Prison Camp at Kamppili, Indonesia, a few days after the Japanese signed the surrender aboard the battleship Missouri. She had suffered much physical and mental torture for years. Prior to the war she and her husband had been doing missionary work and making great progress with Dr. Robert Jaffray. Jaffray and her husband were both now dead. At 28, she was going home with nothing. All her private possessions were gone, her loved ones dead, she was physically ill with exhaustion, starvation, malaria, beriberi and dysentery. She had witnessed terrible atrocities and death. She never received mail while in prison – no outside communication was allowed. As the liberating boat she was on was leaving port she prayed, "Lord, I'll never come here again – they've taken everything that was dear to me."

Then she heard Indonesian voices in the distance – those who had come to know her through the mission, singing, "God be with you till we meet again. By His sheep securely fold you. By His counsels guide uphold you, God be with you till we meet again." She wrote later, "Hearing this song released all my bitterness and the hurt drained from me as my tears flowed – the healing had begun. I knew I would come back to my island home and these people again."
