It is hard to imagine what America was like in the early 1700's before the Revolutionary War and after the arrival of so many people with varied interests and backgrounds. It must have been almost chaotic. Into this chaos Timothy Wright was born in Massachusetts in 1752. He was a brilliant child - learned the alphabet in one lesson, read Latin at the age of 6, read the Bible as a child, taught the catechism to a group of native Americans, entered Yale at age 13, graduated at age 17, wrote his first book at age 20, neglecting sleep and exercise in order to keep his mind free to study. There was a low mark of morality at the time, and professors and students were primarily atheists and infidels. Christians had to meet in secret and communicate in code. He would debate upperclassmen on "Are the scriptures of the Bible the Word of God?" Soon small groups of believers were meeting. The Harvard, Brown and Dartmouth did the

same. This Second Great Awakening provided spiritual leadership America needed for the next generation. Timothy became a pastor and leader. He served as a chaplain with George Washington during the Revolutionary War. A successful farmer, representative in Connecticut State Legislature, on the faculty at Yale, in 1795 he was elected president of Yale. He raised the academic standards and brought spiritual emphasis to the campus. In 1797 Timothy revised Watt's Psalms and Hymns, adding 33 of his own hymns including, "I Love Thy Kingdom, Lord". This collection of hymns was used in New England churches for the next 30 years. All this was accomplished in spite of the fact that he was unable to read for more than 15 minutes at a time without excruciating pain as a result of having had small pox. The hymn, "I Love Thy Kingdom, Lord" is the oldest American hymn that has been in continual use since the 1700's. He wrote it during those revival years at Yale and it expresses his deep love for the Kingdom of God. (Hymn #598 - Blue Covenant Hymnal),

Vs. 1: "I love Thy kingdom, Lord, the house of Thine abode,

The church our blest Redeemer saved with His own precious blood.

Vs. 3: For her my tears shall fall, for her my prayers ascend.

To her my cares and toils be given, till toils and cares shall end.

Vs. 4 Beyond my highest joy I praise her heavenly ways,

Her sweet communion, solemn vows, her hymns of love and praise."

(Editorial comment: Do you suppose we need our own "Third Great Awakening" today??)
