So we do sing *This is the Feast* for all of Easter and we do not sing the Kyrie as this is more of a lament, a crying out to God.

Kelley Bettin, Kiley Bettin, Josie Clow, and Nathaniel Hansen from Waverly will affirm their faith on Sunday, April 29th during 10:30 am worship. High School Youth Group will be meeting on Wednesday April



Parish Cour March 13, 2018

Parish Council Members present include: Jeff Lueth, Deanne Gaalswyk, Deb Philipp, Karen Helvig, Marilyn Cheever and Jody Franck (St Peter's President). Congregational President Jon Borchardt from Trinity and Pastors Eric Midthun and Pastor Anthony Christoffels were also in attendance. Call to Order

There was an Addition of the Parish youth fundraisers to the agenda. Jody Franck made a motion to approve the agenda as presented. Jeff Lueth seconded that motion.

Devotions: Pastor Anthony reviewed the meaning of Holy Week. Beginning with Palm Sunday (passion Sunday) thru

Wednesday each day one of the passion stories could be read from each of the four gospels. Maundy Thursday's theme is eat, drink and serve. Friday is about suffering, Saturday victory and Easter Sunday on the resurrection.

Secretary's Report: Jody Franck made a motion to accept the Secretary's report as written. Deanne Gaalswyk seconded that motion.

Treasurer's report: Jody Franck made a motion to accept January and February Treasurer reports. Jeff Lueth seconded that motion.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Anthony traveled to Arizona at the end of January and visited with five members from our Circle of Faith Parish. He also attended the Minnesota State Wrestling Tourney to watch three of our COF parish youth wrestle. Pastor Anthony has been working on setting up payroll with an online services from Maple Grove called Clergy Financial. Three staff receive paper checks instead and Lisa is creating them each month. The trip to Germany that will be held July 19th-29th has nine people attending (including Pastor Anthony and Stephanie). Pastor Anthony is requesting to put all of his continuing education Dollars to that trip. The Synod says he can roll over a monetary balance from 2017 and all of 18 to use for this trip. Deanne made a motion to use continue ed dollars from 2017 and the continuing ed of 2018 up to \$1000 for the use of the Luther trip to be used in July. Jody Franck seconded that motion.

The new Youth for Christ Director stopped by at Trinity last week to share that the breakfast club is back at Martin County West High School. This is a time that high school kids can come in for pancakes at no charge. Area Pastors and/or caring adults can visit with kids one on one as they are eating and give them some positive adults they can talk with. They will be held on Monday mornings until the end of the school year. They are looking for volunteers to cook pancakes and to assist in clean up.

Pastor Eric Midthun shared that he attended a continuing educational workshop in Colorado. His topics of interest at that workshop included learning about the embodiment of the gospel. He shared with us how bodies are so important and to be enjoyed. In February, Pastor Eric took a week of vacation in March with all of his family. He thanked the parish for this time.

Parish youth fundraisers ,meals for lent: The COF youth have decided to tithe 10% of their fundraiser earnings towards purchasing materials for tie blankets that they will make for Childrens' Hospital patients. Pastors and the youth will travel to the cities in the summer to deliver the blankets to the kids in the hospitals. The balance of the fundraiser money will be saved for a trip for the youth in the summer of 2019. Jon Borchardt is the current youth leader for Circle of Faith Parish, Steph Feely and Jennifer Hughes have been great Parent Volunteers assisting where needed. There was a motion by Deanne Gaalswyk for the COF parish youth money to be a pass thru as a reserve fund item for the youth savings account. Jeff Lueth seconded that motion.

Karen Helvig reported that Gloria Dei church from the cities has offered to pay for the motor coach buses when they transport their members to visit Waverly Church/ Circle of Faith for the Harvest Homecoming. They have agreed to do pulpit supply three times this year without cost from our Parish when Stephanie is deployed to give respite and family time to Pastor Anthony. Their adult choir will come down for a weekend and provide a joint service when they are here. Circle of Faith has been invited to join in a mission trip to Guatemala where members may be working at food shelves or working at repairing houses that could be hurricane proof.

Parish Summer Picnic:

There is a possibility of Sunday, August 5th at 10 am to have a service we will be calling Worship on the water with the Pastors on a Pontoon leading the service and members can pull up with their boats or sit on the shore at Jon and Karen Helvig's home on Fox Lake with potluck to follow.

There are several possibilities of things we can be working on this year. There will more discussion about our direction at our next meeting.

There was a discussion of having each church council deciding on their own if there is interest to have members walk in the parades this summer.



Sir John Bowring, who wrote this hymn, was considered to be a remarkable man. Born in 1792, he was thought to be one of the greatest linguists that ever lived. Before he was sixteen he had mastered 5 languages without the aid of a teacher. Before his death he could converse in over 100 languages and was a member of the learned society in Europe. He had been knighted by Queen Victoria, served two terms in The House of Commons, and was appointed Governor of Hong Kong. He also had written several books on politics, religion, economics, poetry and many hymns. In spite of all that he is most remembered for this simple hymn, "In the Cross of Christ I glory." It has been reported that Sir Bowring had visited Macao, on the south coast of China and was so impressed by the sight of a bronze cross standing on the ruins of a great cathedral. The building had been built by the Portuguese but had been destroyed by a typhoon, leaving the cross standing high above the ruins. Bowring was inspired by Galatians 6:14 which reads, "God forbid that I should glory, save in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ."

Vs. 1: In the cross of Christ I glory. towering o'er the wrecks of time; All the light of sacred story gathers round its head sublime.

Vs 2: When the woes of life o'ertake me, hopes deceive, and fears annoy, Never shall the cross forsake me; Lo! it glows with peace and joy.

There are three more verses - all proclaiming the strength and peace you can receive just by glorying in the cross of Christ.

There is a funny story about the music for this hymn. The tune used now was written in 1851 by Thamar Conkey, organist and choir master who left the service at Central Baptist Church in Norwich, right after he had played the prelude one Sunday. He was very angry because the choir members were all absent to sing the choir number. That afternoon he sat down and wrote a new hymn tune and took it to church for the evening service. Someone asked him what he wanted to name the tune. He replied "Rathbun" because she was the one soprano that showed up for the evening service! Choir members - - BEWARE!
