Old Business – Discussed the children's floor mat that had been discussed and approved by the council last year but never done. Talked about putting it up front with quiet toys and have an adult supervising the time. The children would need to stay on the mat and be quiet during the service. Mats will be gotten.

New Business – Check signing in case of an emergency was discussed. When the treasurer is gone, the office usually has a couple of checks that are signed so that any bills that come in and need to be paid can be taken care of. Bob made a motion, seconded by Brian to have Leah Gerhardt be able to sign checks in the case of an emergency. Motion carried.

Building Renovation Plan was discussed. Brian had gotten bids on replacing the siding and some windows. Mixson and Borderline wouldn't bid on the project but Brian got bids from three other companies with both steel and vinyl siding being quoted. The bids ranged from \$60,000+ for vinyl siding to \$70,000+ for the steel siding at today's prices knowing that the price would be higher in a year. These prices did not include anything extra that they might find that needs to be repaired before putting the siding on.

John read a letter that was received in the mail from a company out of Winona that takes a look at stained glass windows and what repairs might need to be done. John reached out to them but has not heard back. They do a free evaluation. We know that there is no caulking left around the stained glass windows and there is some lead that needs to be redone. Will wait to see if John hears back from them.

Lonnie made a motion to adjourn, Zane seconded it. Motion carried. We closed with the Lord's Prayer. Next meeting will be Tuesday, November 13, 2018 at 7:30 p.m.

Next council meeting will follow Sunday services on Nov 11th or 18th.







"Oh, How I Love Jesus"

This hymn is more about "why" rather than "how". The last words of the chorus are, "Because He first loved me". The verses were actually written by a British clergyman, Frederich Whitfield in1865. He likely never heard the chorus because it was a nineteenth center American Folk Song usually sung at camp meetings of the time. The song is really about Jesus' name.

Vs. 1: There is a name I love to hear, I love to sing its' worth; It sounds like music in mine ear, the sweetest name on earth. Oh, how I love Jesus, oh, how I love Jesus, because He first loved me.

Vs. 2: It tells me of a Savior's love, who died to set me free, It tells me of His precious blood, the sinners perfect plea. Oh, how I love Jesus, oh, how I love Jesus, because He first loved me.

Vs. 3: It tells me what my Father hath in store for every day And tho' I tread a darksome path, yields sunshine all the way. Oh, how I love Jesus, oh, how I love Jesus, because He first loved me.

Vs. 4: It tells of One whose loving heart can feel my deepest woe, Who in each sorrow bears a part that none can bear below.
