Dear Friends of Circle of Faith,

I am so looking forward to getting to know all of you! I've been living in Minnesota for almost 10 years now, but I grew up in the part of Northern Illinois that isn't Chicago, and I've been Lutheran all my life. I went to college and seminary in Iowa, and moved to Minnesota when I married my husband, Rory, who does tech support for a TaylorCorp company. We live in Blue Earth, which is where he grew up, and we have a cat named Maggie, short for Magdalena. My sermons tend to be practical, and not too long! If Martin Luther loved to answer the question, "What does this mean?" then I love to answer the question, "What does this mean for us, right now?" I'm especially looking forward to when church choirs become a normal part of life again.

I'm about a month past my second vaccine shot, so I'm fully vaccinated. I was able to get my shots a little early because I was working with another church before I came here. I realize that many of you are also fully vaccinated, and that's wonderful! The more of us who receive the vaccine, the safer we make our churches and our communities for everyone.

However, I expect many people in each of our congregations are still in the partial stage of getting vaccinated, not yet a full 2 weeks past their second shot. So despite the recent CDC announcement about it being safe for fully vaccinated people to not wear masks in most situations, these people who aren't past their full waiting period will still need to mask up like usual. And of course, some who intend to get vaccinated haven't been able to start the process yet, and none of the vaccines have been approved for children under 12.

So I intend to continue wearing a mask to church on Sunday mornings until no one has to wear a mask anymore. If I can make one person feel more safe or more welcome by wearing a mask, I will do so. I especially hope it will help the kids under 12 feel more welcome and a part of things at worship. However, I do understand that some people have difficulties hearing, so while I will be wearing a mask for most of Sunday mornings, I will briefly remove it when I speak in leading worship: for announcements, scripture, the sermon, and prayers. When we meet each other aside from Sunday mornings, I will probably not be wearing a mask. However, if you would ever like me to put on a mask, please feel free to ask, I plan to always have one with me.

We've all been through a lot in these past 14 months, we've learned a lot, and many of us are personally familiar with the toll that Covid-19 can take. While we're nearing the end of this crisis, we're not quite there yet. But as Christians we know that putting up with the minor inconvenience of wearing a mask is well worth it, for the love of our neighbors who would find Covid-19 far more dangerous than we would. Each time I see a person wearing a mask, I give thanks for that person's care for my health, even as I look forward to the day when all this is behind us.

MOST OF THE TIME when we say people are charismatic, we mean simply that they have presence. Bill Cosby, Charles Manson, the Princess of Wales, Dr. Ruth Westheimer all have it in varying degrees and forms. So did Benito Mussolini and Mae West. You don't have to be famous to have it either. You come across it in children and nobodies. Even if you don't see such people enter a room, you can feel them enter. They shimmer the air like a hot asphalt road. Without so much as raising a finger, they make you sit up and take notice.

On the other hand, if you took Mother Teresa, or Francis of Assisi, or Mahatma Gandhi, or the man who risked his neck smuggling Jews out of Nazi Germany, and dressed them up to look like everybody else, nobody would probably notice them any more than they would the woman who can make your day just by dropping by to borrow your steam iron, or the high school commencement speaker who without any eloquence or special intelligence can bring tears to your eyes, or the people who can quiet an hysterical child or stop somebody's cracking headache just by touching them with their hands. These are the true charismatics, from the Greek word *charis* meaning 'grace'. According to Saint Paul, out of sheer graciousness God gives certain men and women extraordinary gifts or *charismata* such as the ability to heal, to teach, to perform acts of mercy, to work miracles.

These people are not apt to have presence, and you don't feel any special vibrations when they enter a room. But they are all in their own ways miracle-workers, and even if you don't believe in the God who made them that way, you believe in them.

We are excited to announce that we have a new notification service called *GroupCast*. This service will provide us with the same notification options as we have had with *Honeywell*, and so much more.

Why Change?

We have been using *Honeywell Instant Alert* for the last five years to notify members of Circle of Faith about worship services and cancellations, funerals and meeting reminders. This past fall we were notified that the *Honeywell Instant Alert* service would be discontinued as of August 2021. *GroupCast* is matching the price we have been paying for *Honeywell*, and they have locked in that price for the next five years.

What's Next?

If you had been receiving a text message notification through our *Honeywell* system, you will soon receive an Opt-In text message from *GroupCast*.

- If you want to continue receiving text messages, there is nothing that you need to do.
- If you wish to stop receiving text messages, the text message you receive from *GroupCast* will have instructions on how you can Opt-Out.

If you have not been receiving phone calls or text messages about our worship services, please contact the parish office to update your contact information. We will get you added to our new notification system.

Marilyn called meeting to order

Secretary's report was given. Council went through the banners and threw out old banners due to water damage.

Treasurers report was presented by Aubrey. Our quarterly payment to Circle of Faith was made, our next big payment is July 1st.

Old Business The possibility of putting funds from our Savings account into an endowment plan was discussed. The benefits of endowment funds would be they have better returns than a savings account. We could use the dividend checks for our benevolence spending instead of using our general fund. It takes \$25,000 to start, they require all transactions be at least \$2000. We can go below the \$25,000 if we need to money for emergency use. We will vote on this decision as a congregation, we will have bylaws written to suit our own congregation needs. Motion by Jim to present this to our congregation, 2nd by Dale.

Pastor Anthony is done on May 17th. With this Parish council is looking to hire 2 full time pastors. They are also looking into adding First Lutheran in Trimont to our Parish. St. Peter worship schedule would not change with this.

There will be a congregational vote on adding First Lutheran to our Parish.

Synod Assembly is online this year with bishop election and vote. This takes place on June 6th, 11th and 12th. If you are interested in watching this please let Lisa at the office know.

Waverly Council Sunday, May 2

Waverly Council met on Sunday, May 2 after the 10:30 church service. President Bob Olson called the meeting to order.

Treasure report was read and approved. (Circle of Faith is paid through the end of June)

PASTOR'S REPORT: Pastor Katherine C Rohloff (Interim Pastor) will be starting May 17. Here first Sunday service will be May 23 with rotating church services. Pastor Anthony reported on the Four Point Parish Agreement. A very thorough proposal has been drawn up and reviewed. First Lutheran, Trinity and St. Peter councils have all agreed to the proposal. A motion was made and seconded to accept the proposal. This will go to the Parish Council for final approval. A second parish office will be added at First Lutheran in Trimont if the final vote is approved. The office hours will remain the same with a combined total of 18 hours per week. The Circle of Faith phone number will have the ability to ring in both offices and both offices will function as a parish office. Lisa Wohlhuter will remain in Welcome and Lila Cutler will be the secretary in Trimont.

NEW BUSINESS: Waverly internet service is now off the Armbrust Tower, so there will be no further internet expense. GroupCast will be our new notification service. Heidi Clow, Lacey and Troy Schmidtke will train to be the persons sending out alerts and messages. Motion made and seconded to apply for a \$500 grant from the endowment fund to help pay expenses for any child wishing to attend Green Lake Bible Camp. Family would be expected to make the down payment and the money would then be available to pay camping expenses.

OLD BUSINESS: Gwen reported on the information she has gathered on the kitchen and bathroom floor. Asbestos need to removed from both the kitchen and bathroom floors. The cost would be approx. \$2,700 and Mary Circle has agreed to pay for the removal and cleanup of asbestos. New flooring for both the kitchen and bathroom, including labor would be \$3,620.31. Motion made and carried to take the money out of Gifts and Memorial Fund for this project. Security of the church was briefly discussed. Some options could include cameras vs. number locks on doors. Pastor suggested a timed lock on the doors which would be set to automatically lock and then unlock at certain times. Further discussion will be needed.

Council will meet 3/x a year or as needed. Motion made and carried to adjourn the meeting.
