

Dear Circle of Faith,

As you may know, Martin Luther himself lived through a pandemic, and during that time he wrote a letter giving guidance to Christians in similar circumstances: "Whether One May Flee From a Deadly Plague." While thankfully medical science has advanced considerably since the 1500s, much of his advice remains very applicable to our everyday lives and choices.

Dr. Luther starts by pointing out that needlessly risking your life in a plague is no different than staying inside a burning house, or refusing to swim if you fall into water. Instead, we must always help our neighbor if we can. If they are already receiving enough help, you don't need to pile on, but you must not get in the way of the help they're receiving. Anyone who is able to help their neighbor who isn't already receiving help, but instead abandons them, breaks Luther's explanation of the 5th Commandment, "Thou shalt not murder," because that endangers their lives. The urge to do that comes only from the devil.

Luther goes on to say that if it was Jesus or his mother Mary who were sick, we would be delighted to help any way we could. And Jesus tells us that how you treat your neighbor is how you would treat him, in Matthew 25:40. Therefore, so that we remain able to help each other, each of us must "act toward others that no one becomes unnecessarily endangered on [your] account and so cause another's death. ...But if some are too panicky and desert their neighbors in their plight, and if some are so foolish as not to take precautions but aggravate the contagion, then the devil has a heyday, and many will die. On both counts this is a grievous offense to God and to man...." He concludes with some practical advice on living in a pandemic which was based on the medical knowledge available at the time.

Right now, throughout our country, the healthcare system is under enormous strain, in may places worse than it was during the first waves of the pandemic. ICU beds, even the ones for children, are in short supply or unavailable in many places. These beds are not only needed for those fighting Covid-19, but also for people who have had any number of health concerns. Many people are now not receiving the medical treatment they need because there are so many Covid-19 patients filling the healthcare system. Many others continue to not take precautions and aggravate the pandemic.

Considering all of the above, we, your pastors, want to make clear: it is indeed right, our duty and our joy, to wear masks as necessary to protect our neighbors, and to receive the vaccine (those who can receive it). For those who cannot, we give thanks for the ability to participate in our community and attend worship online. To do anything else would get in the way of the help our neighbors are receiving, and that would break the 5th Commandment. As Dr. Luther would put it, for the love of God and your neighbor, please do so.

Treasurer Report: Deanne presented the treasurer report and is looking into ways to reduce the Frontier telephone bill. A landline is needed because of the elevator but otherwise is seldom used. Questions concerning the CFS L.P. June bill will be addressed. Checking account balance \$64,097.63. MM made by Gwen and seconded by Kevin to accept the treasurer report. Motion carried.

Faith Formation: Getting ready for the start of S.S. However with the increase in covid cases in Martin County plans may have to be changed. S.S. uncertain at this time.

Caring Ministries: In person visits have been suspended since Pandemic started. They will be sending more cards and making phone calls to shut-ins.

OLD BUSINESS:

1 camper attended Green Lake Bible Camp & expenses were paid by the church.

B.R. has been painted and new flooring installed. Gwen checking into a vanity with sink & Kevin agreed to install. New lights above vanity will also be added. Kitchen Flooring paid for by the Gifts/Memorial fund has been installed – toe kicks will be placed this week. Countertop, 2 sinks & faucets will be replaced. 2 stoves have been purchased by the Mary Circle and are ready to deliver. App. Cost of these remaining kitchen projects is \$6,000.

NEW BUSINESS:

The steeple will be repainted. The cost of a crane is \$175.00/hr. Estimated need for 15 gallons of paint is app. #\$3,000. A brief congregational meeting will be held after church to update members and ask for approval of \$9,000.00 to cover the remaining payment of the kitchen and steeple

The Endowment fund has received a gift from the Dick Helvig family. Waverly has been listed as one of the recipients of the estate of Pastor Robert Onka. Pastor Kay brought up for discussion concerns regarding the recent surge in covid cases in our county. It was stated N-95 masks would be more beneficial and this will be discussed at Parish Council.

No further business, Lynette moved we adjourn and Deanne seconded the motion.

We then closed with the Lord's Prayer.


