Helping Our Neighbors

Recent days have seen an earthquake in Haiti, a humanitarian crisis in Afghanistan, wildfires in the American west, and Hur-

ricane Ida. Many people are in need. We'd like to remind you that one way you can help is to donate to Lutheran Disaster Response! You can donate online – there's a recent post on our Facebook page for Circle of Faith Parish that will take you to the website you can donate through – or bring a check to the church office and we'll mail it in for you. Checks payable to: Lutheran Disaster Response.

If you want to be more specific about where your money goes, you can put something like "hurricane Ida" or "US Wildfires" or "Haiti" in the notes line, or else it will just go where the need is greatest.

Earthquake In Haiti

In August 2021, a devastating 7.2 magnitude earthquake struck southwest Haiti. Over 1,400 people were killed, and thousands more were injured. Blocked roads are delaying the delivery of vital supplies to hospitals. At least 26,000 homes were damaged or destroyed. For over two decades, the ELCA has maintained a presence in southern Haiti through support for agricultural and sustainable development work. To continue our engagement with those communities, Lutheran Disaster Response is collaborating with partner organizations in the communities to meet relief needs, including food, nonfood items and temporary shelter. Other areas of support will include psychosocial care, water and sanitation, and creating sustainable livelihoods through agriculture and livestock.

Crisis in Afghanistan

The United States has withdrawn from the war in Afghanistan. The United States has been evacuating thousands of Afghans who served alongside Americans. The withdrawal deadline of Aug. 31 has caused pressure on resettlement agencies to accompany Afghan families, thousands of whom have arrived in the final months. In Afghanistan, many Afghans are seeking safety in Kabul, but this influx of internally displaced people (IDPs) is burdening a weakened infrastructure. Lutheran Disaster Response is reaching out to synods and affiliates that are taking a role in welcoming Afghan families. Lutheran Disaster Response is also in partnership with Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service (LIRS) and Church World Service (CWS). To respond to the humanitarian crisis in Afghanistan, Community World Service Asia (CWSA) is assisting Afghan families in Kabul through food security and cash assistance. Lutheran Disaster Response contributed to ACT Alliance's Rapid Response Fund, which is funding CWSA's work.

Wildfires

The 2021 wildfire season is devastating the western United States. A prolonged drought and extreme heat waves are causing wildfires to spread rapidly, which makes them difficult to contain. California is currently the hardest-hit state – the Dixie Fire, in Northern California, is already the second largest wildfire in the state's history, having burned over 505,000 acres. Tens of thousands of people are under evacuation orders, and hundreds of buildings have been destroyed. Lutheran Disaster Response is working with synods and social ministry organizations in California and other western states to develop a coordinated response to the wildfires. We anticipate that immediate needs will include food and other necessities, as well as emotional and spiritual care for those who have been traumatized.

Hurricane Ida

Hurricane Ida made landfall near New Orleans on Aug. 29 – exactly 16 years after Hurricane Katrina. As a strong Category 4 storm, Hurricane Ida's 150 mph winds, torrential rain and strong storm surge caused widespread flooding and wind damage in southeastern Louisiana and coastal Mississippi. Strong winds knocked out power lines and electrical substations, leaving more than 1 million people without power, including the entirety of New Orleans. The impact of Ida is yet to be fully assessed, but with a hurricane of this scale, rebuilding will be costly and take years. Immediate needs will include basic necessities and temporary housing.




