The Easter Vigil service is not a new worship service, but rather the conclusion of the *Triduum* (one worship service stretched over three days). The *Triduum* is Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday (the Easter Vigil). You may recall that the Maundy Thursday service begins as normal, but "ends" with everyone leaving in silence without the benediction. Then we enter in silence on Good Friday without an invocation and again leave in silence without the benediction. The Easter Vigil is the conclusion of this three day worship service. We will enter in silence for the Easter Vigil, but we will finally end like we normally do with the benediction.

However, the Easter Vigil is unlike any other worship service you have ever been to. This service is a cross between high church liturgy (which is what you are used to seeing during our Sunday morning worship services) and bible camp skits. We begin this service outside (weather permitting) with a fire and a candlelit procession into the church. When we enter the church, we notice that the altar is still stripped from Maundy Thursday and the sanctuary still has the look/feel of Good Friday. As we go through the service, foundational stories of our faith are read and told in creative ways. There also comes a point in the service where we transition from darkness to light, from Good Friday to Easter, from death to life. You will get to see, hear, and feel this transition.

After the service, there will be a reception to celebrate the Resurrection of Our Lord. And what better way to celebrate our God overcoming the grave and death itself, than to have festive foods and beverages that you would find at other celebrations like New Years, weddings, and graduations. Our reception is to celebrate the reality that Jesus Christ is not dead in a tomb, but alive. Therefore, we will be serving chocolate fondue, meat and cheese trays, champagne and sparkling cider.

This is certainly a service that you don't want to miss. Mark this on your calendar and plan on attending. The service will take approximately 2 hours, but don't worry, you won't even notice that it is taking that long. There are so many different things happening that time will just fly by.

The Easter Vigil is such a big service to put together that we have teamed up with Partners in Ministry (First Lutheran and United Methodist in Trimont). We have 40-50 people from all 5 churches helping put this service on. If you get asked to help please consider helping. If you'd like to help please talk to Pastor Anthony. And even if you are not helping, please plan on coming, you'll be glad that you did!

PASTOR ΑΝΤΗΟΝΥ'S RIPPLES

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

In last month's article, I wrote about the 40 days of Lent as we had just begun this penitential season. Now we are coming to the end of these 40 days, which will indeed come to an end on Maundy Thursday. And before we begin the 50 days of Easter, which is what we look forward to in Lent, we first will go through a three day feast called the Triduum (meaning "The Three Days"). These three days are Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday. This is one worship service that is stretched over three days. We begin the Triduum with Maundy Thursday, where we recount and remember the command (or mandate) that Jesus gave his disciples, "Do this for the remembrance of me." This service will be hosted by St. Peter beginning at 7:00 pm.

Then on Good Friday we return three day feast, and during this count and remember our This service will be hosted by pm. Then on Holy Saturday return once again to the day feast with the Easter Vigil.

service, we retell the foundational stories of our faith in creative, dramatic ways. We also see, hear, and feel the transition from Good Friday to Easter Sunday, the transition from darkness to light, from death to life. We then finally conclude our three day feast with a festive reception to celebrate our Lord's resurrection from the dead. The Easter Vigil service will be hosted by Trinity beginning at 6:30 pm with a New Fire!

Holy Week is certainly an important time for us Christians. It is the week where we slow down and remember the road that our Savior took to the cross for the forgiveness of all of our sins. I highly encourage you to make the Triduum a priority this year (and every year). In order to fully see and experience the beauty of the three day feast, it is important to attend each day of the Three Days. If you can't make all of the services, please come to the ones you can. Services like this only happen once a year. Plus, the Easter Vigil is unlike any other service that you have ever been to.

Blessings to you as we approach the holiest of weeks. The week were we come to worship, receiving the full promise of forgiveness and absolution of our sins, and praise God for the sacrifice that He made on the cross through Jesus's death and resurrection. Blessings to you and I look forward to seeing you at the Triduum, the three day feast of our Lord's crucifixion, death, and resurrection.

PASTOR ERIC'S RIPPLES

We have been thinking about the things the early Christians did from Acts chapter 2. We thought about the sharing, the fellowship, the rejoicing and the praying. Now we think about worship: The first Christians spent much time at the temple, they broke bread and they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching.

Since we are in Lent and looking forward to Holy Week and Easter, I'll share some thoughts about our worship during this time. The earliest writing we have in the New Testament are the letters of the apostle Paul. It is interesting that he did not write about any of the teachings of Jesus or the healings and miracles. The only words of Jesus that he shares are the words Jesus said at the last supper, the words of institution. Other than that he mostly just refers to the death and resurrection of Jesus and what that means for our lives. In a sense, for Paul, everything important for the Christian life is found in what we learn and celebrate from Maundy Thursday through Easter Sunday.

So, this is a big deal. It reminds me that God has power over life and death. It reminds me that God uses death to bring life. It reminds me that God will bring me though death into life. This promise is made real every time I hear the story and every time I am given the body and blood of God's very own son, Jesus. No matter how the powers of the world or of other spiritual forces try to destroy God and God's love for me they will fail. The Holy Week worship journey brings me back home, year after year, to this foundation; my life in Christ. And yours too.

In a year when a bishop election is held in the Southwestern Minnesota Synod, the constitution calls for each conference assembly to nominate five members of the ELCA clergy roster for the office of synod bishop (S9.04.01). After following the process outlines in the constitution, the ten conferences of the Southwestern Minnesota Synod, ELCA nominated six pastors for the office of Synod Bishop at their Sunday, February 22, assemblies. Nominations Are now closed. The six pastors who have been nominated are:

Rev. Jon Anderson — Southwestern Minnesota Synod, Bishop

Rev. Paul Lutter - St Olaf Lutheran Church - Austin, MN

Rev. Steve Olson — Gethsemane Lutheran Church — Dassel, MN

Rev. Laurie Skow-Anderson — Director for Evangelical Mission/Assistant to Bishop—Synod of WI

Rev. Lyle Snyder — First English Lutheran Church — Tyler, MN

Rev. Timothy Wittwer — Gustavus Adolphus Lutheran Church — Foley, MN

The bishop election will take place at our Synod Assembly, June 12-14, 2015, at Gustavus Adolphus College in St. Peter. Information about the nominees is posted on our SW MN Synod website (www.swmnelca.org) and will also be available in the Synod Assembly pre-assembly report. Members of the synod will have an opportunity to hear nominees speak at four Bishop Nominee Forums, listed below. The nominees forums are open to the public.

For voting members of the SW MN Synod Assembly, there will be a nominee forum on Friday, June 12th following Opening worship (3 pm) in Christ Chapel. The first ballot will be on Friday evening at approximately 7:30 pm. The term for bishop is six years and begins on September 1, 2015. Please pray for our synod and the election Process as we prepare to elect our bishop.

Motion by Jody Frank, seconded by Jon Saxen, to approve the agenda as amended. Motion passed.

Pr. Anthony presented devotions based on Acts 2:41-47. What does "the" mean in "the prayers"? Examples: prayers of the church, people, intercession. Teaching, fellowship, breaking of bread, prayers. What is a good prayer? As a parish, we have been inundated with prayer needs, and pastoral care needs recently. Saying their names can be enough. Naming is important. Jesus said before teaching his disciples the Lord's prayer that prayers don't need to be long. God knows what you need. Quick prayer is good. "Arrow prayers." Shoot an arrow prayer up to God quick.

Kirsten Rabbe presented the Secretary's report for the February 10, 2015 Parish Council meeting. Change Jay Burmeister not Jay Borchardt. Motion by Jody Franck, seconded by Jon Saxen, to approve the Secretary's report as changed. Motion passed.

Jon Saxen presented the February 2015 Operating Statement to the Parish Council. Will add in ¼ of 2015 technology fund addition (annual total of \$1500) at the end of each quarter. Motion by Merle Burmeister, seconded by Jody Franck, to approve the Treasurer's report as presented. Motion passed.

PASTORS' REPORTS

Pastor Anthony's report

. Pastor handed out the Leadership Organizational Chart for 2015 for Circle of Faith Parish. Please note: Jesus is at the head of this parish.

. Easter Vigil coming up – April 4th. Holy Week Schedule will be: Palm Sunday – all churches. Maundy Thursday – at St. Peter, Good Friday – at Waverly, Easter Vigil – at Trinity. Easter Vigil is a cross between higher liturgical stuff and bible camp. Explained the redressing of the altar, during the service. Transition from Good Friday to Easter during the service. Champagne and Chocolate Fondue reception to follow. Starts at 6:30 pm so that the service doesn't end later than 8 – 8:30. Will publicize.

Pastor Eric's report

.Thanks for the continuing education last month. Went to Colorado. *Leading in the midst of change*. One presenter: "We all know how to change. In churches – to change is to help people remember that they have changed, and what skills they have to change.: Another speaker: the book of Daniel: "Second Temple Judaism". That's the Judaism that Christianity grew out of. Much of our theology comes out of this.

OLD BUSINESS

Mission Statement Summary

Pastor Anthony reminded us of all the work we did last month on the mission statement. Last month he asked the Parish Council 2 questions: what do we do well, what things do we neglect? Recap: We "do well": sharing a hope for the future, welcome our neighbors within our own congregations, gathering in faith in worship, trusting God to lead us through. Need to concentrate on: growing our ministry, sharing the Good News outside our own ministry, so we can share our hope for the future. We set two kinds of goals: Ministry Goals: 1) Trying different or additional worship times to increase participation, 2) Reaching out to non-active members, 3) Joint Circle of Faith Mission Project. Administrative Goals: 4) Write Sexual Misconduct Policy – before January, 2015, 5) Revise Wedding Policy, 5) Create Funeral Policy, 6) Create New Congregations Policy for adding others to Circle of Faith.

Reaching out to members on our fringes and our community: This summer, we will continue what Carl did last summer. 3-4 evenings during the summer, theological education (bring in interesting speakers), with food and worship. Discussed the need to "clean" our membership rosters, separate into groups by type of ministry needed: active, have left the church but not the roster, local but inactive, or extended family members. This is the responsibility of individual congregations, was begun by the Communications Team survey last fall. Consider how to reach out to all these people: e.g. still receive the newsletter, etc.. There was an example of one Florida gentleman who still receives Waverly's newsletter, still contributes to the church, even though he lives far away. Discuss, how do we keep everyone included in our ministry. Pastor will get Lisa and Eileen to get a roster of EVERYBODY to cong. presidents to work on.

Sexual Misconduct Policy – Discussed sources of policies we could adapt for our use, taking the Synod's proposed policy to our insurance agent and ask if this will meet the need. Keep policy short, understandable. Suggested possible committee members – Pr. Anthony will contact. Limit the number of pages. Council members: bring back resources next month.

Wedding & Funeral Policies – Suggested possible committee members. Pr. Anthony will contact. Current policy is in the book. Suggested that the same committee complete both policy manuals.

New Congregations Policy: Suggested possible committee members. Parish Council will contact them.

These three committees will be Task oriented (short term jobs) – when the task is done, your job is done. Pr. Anthony will work with each of the committees.

NEW BUSINESS

Mission Outreach – South Africa

Joint Mission Project: Pastor Anthony shared. There is a church being built in South Africa. The materials are ordered, Nsongeni, South Africa. The town moved to be closer to a highway. The church stayed in the old location, but it makes sense for the church to follow the people rather than the other way around. Pr. Duma, Dean of this congregation's South African circuit came to COF last fall. Watonwan River Conference, to which Circle of Faith belongs, has committed to raise \$22,000 by WRC, between all the congregations and people in our conference. Butternut church has led the way by committing \$1000, and are challenging every congregation in our conference to match that. (We have 25 congregations including Trinity-Welcome, Waverly-Trimont, and St. Peter-Ceylon.) Motion by Kirsten Rabbe, seconded by Jon Saxen, that COF recommend to our congregations that they consider supporting the building of the Nsongeni, South Africa church. Motion passed. The congregation will send us picture updates, as work progresses. Nancy suggested that we should reply with photos of our fundraising events to support them. Pastor will get copies of the letter to Congregational Presidents, who will take it from there.

Parish Worship Times

Discussion on a suggested summer worship time change. One congregation considering an alternative. Council made recommendations, considering Pastors' schedules, and all three congregations. Will send this recommendation back to the Congregation for consideration.

The next Circle of Faith Parish Council meeting will be April 14, 2015, 6:00 pm, at Trinity in Welcome. Motion by Jon Saxen, seconded by Jody Franck, to adjourn the meeting at x pm. Motion passed. JS/JF.

APRIL 2015 Seminarian's Letter Home

To the membership of Circle of Faith Parish:

Greetings to you all from Evanston, IL! Finally, the snow is melting, temperatures are rising, and the days are getting longer. Spring is here! With spring comes Holy Week, and for the first time as Circle of Faith, our celebration of Holy Week will include the Easter Vigil. It's something that every Christian needs to experience, the night when heaven and earth, past and present, mingle and meld. It's different from some worship services that we know, especially in terms of how much Scripture we read.

In the "full Vigil," we're supposed to read twelve Old Testament stories, sing a Psalm in between each one, then read a piece from Romans, then the Gospel – twenty-six readings in all! I once attended a Vigil where the pastor asked why we needed a sermon, since we had just listened to pretty much the entire Bible! We won't be doing all those for our Vigil, I assure you, but we'll be doing several. The reason is that we begin where all things began – at creation. We go through Scripture – Noah's ark, the rescue from Egypt and walk through the Red Sea, the fiery furnace, the valley of dry bones – all the way to the resurrection. Then the story actually goes one step further, when we either baptize new Christians or reaffirm our own baptisms. The story of how God acted throughout history, the story of how it all began and how it all will end – in the hands of God – stretches out to us on that night. We're part of the story of what God does everyday. Seems like that's something worth spending time with, isn't it? We do that every Sunday in small pieces, but on the Vigil night, we really get a fun view of it.

Preparing to celebrate Easter's feast of new life and new light, we pray for God's blessing, using these words:

Almighty God, you give us the joy of celebrating our Lord's resurrection. Give us also the joys of life in your service, and bring us at last to the full joy of life eternal, through Jesus Christ our Savior and Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen. [ELW, The Resurrection of our Lord]



Create a simple yet powerful Easter display.

What you need:

- · 3 wood blocks (small, medium, large)
- · Acrylic paint (three pastel colors and white)
- Paintbrush
- Water
- Paper towels
- · Letter stencils and tape (optional)

What you do:

- 1. Paint each block of wood a different pastel color. (You can paint the whole block or just one side.)
- 2. When paint is dry, use white paint to write (or stencil) "He" on the smallest block, "is" on the medium block and "risen!" on the large block.
- 3. When blocks are dry, stack them from largest to smallest to proclaim "He is risen!"



John Ernest Bode (1816–1874) was highly educated and became a deacon, priest and vicar in the Church of England. He was a poet and wrote a book full of hymns, also giving lectures on poetry at Oxford. However, he is really only famous for one hymn, "O Jesus, I Have Promised". It was written especially for his daughter and two sons' confirmation in 1866, and has become known as "Hymn for the Newly Confirmed". It was chosen by Rev. P. B Stensland in the mid 1940's to be sung when my class was confirmed (the class also included Jack Potter, Arlen Johnson, Marlene Rattike, Marlys Pickett). And it seems to be the hymn of choice even today. It pledges total commitment to God, "to serve You to the end." It closes with, "O give me grace to follow, my Master and my Friend." Perhaps we should remind ourselves of this commitment we make to God – how often we catch ourselves NOT doing what we should – but God is always there to take us back – He NEVER breaks his promise to us.
