"God's Work, Our Hands" is the ELCA's tagline or motto. If someone wanted to know what an ELCA congregation is all about, this motto or tagline would tell them exactly what a church in the ELCA is all about.

- "Our Hands" we are the ones that do the work. We don't create the plan, we just execute the plan. We are God's servants, called to be His hands and feet in this world. We work for God.

This motto, "God's Work, Our Hands" is <u>our</u> motto because we are the ELCA. On Sunday, September 7th, nearly 10,000 ELCA congregations will put on yellow/gold T-shirts and take to the streets in this world to be God's hands and feet. Circle of Faith plans to take to the streets in Ceylon, Trimont, and Welcome areas on September 7th, joining with nearly 4 million other Lutherans to let the world know that the church is here. We are not here just for have nice buildings, but to spread the Gospel (the Good News of Jesus Christ) to the world through our hands. We do not have a specific project set yet. So if you have an idea please share it with one of the pastors or a parish council member. We have already been getting some great ideas and we will be making a decision in time for the September Ripples of Faith.

Dear friends,

Over the past year at Circle of Faith we thought about <u>who we are.</u> We reflected on images like a royal priesthood, a holy nation and God's own people. Circle of Faith Parish Council Meeting Minutes July 8, 2014

Meeting was called to order at Trinity Lutheran in Welcome at 6:08 pm by Vice-President Jon Saxen. Other members present: Merle Burmeister, Marilyn Cheever, Jody Franck, Jon Helvig, Kirsten Rabbe. Staff present: Pastor Eric Midthun and Ministerial Associate Carl Rabbe.

Motion by Jody Franck, seconded by Merle Burmeister, to approve agenda. Motion passed.

Pr. Eric led devotions - "What We Do". Acts 2. First things the early Christians did: "devoted to Apostles teaching, fellowship, breaking of bread, and prayer." They were "filled with awe and wonder, and did everything together with glad and sincere hearts." The Lord added daily to their number. And they continued to share with those in need. This can be a great example for Circle of Faith as we examine what it is that we do and should do.

Kirsten Rabbe presented the Secretary's report for the June 10, 2014 Parish Council meeting. Motion by Marilyn Cheever, seconded by Jon Helvig, to approve the Secretary's report as presented. Motion passed.

Jon Saxen presented the June 2014 Operating Statement. Motion by Jon Helvig, seconded by Jody Franck, to approve the Treasurer's report as presented. Motion passed.

PASTORS' REPORTS

Pastor Eric Midthun – no report.

Ministerial Associate Carl Rabbe's report

Carl thanked COF for the opportunity to be back and join with us in ministry. 40+ people were present at the first Wednesday night discussion. Worship was beautiful, food was great, as was the discussion.

Carl discussed Synod Assembly and other pastoral conflicts when members wish to schedule weddings. Carl suggested the Parish Council & Pastors have a conversation about wedding requests in September when both pastors will be at the meeting.

Carl asked that members please let the Parish Office know when someone (you or others) goes into the hospital or for medical treatment/surgery. This helps us care for our members better. This was followed by a discussion about how we handle emergency coverage for pastoral care needs. Doesn't happen often, and pastors are always happy to respond. How do we want the pastors to handle this if neither pastor is in the area or available at the time of a call? How do we set reasonable expectations and a standard our members can depend on? Discussed creating an item members could keep at home or in their wallet with COF contact information on it – refrigerator magnet or business card (referred to Comm Team to develop this). Marilyn Cheever will check with the Fairmont hospital regarding chaplaincy coverage in case of emergencies.

OLD BUSINESS

God's Work Our Hands Sunday – project ideas

September 7th. Suggestions for service projects: mowing lawns in town that don't get done to spruce up the community, ask Crest for ideas, also check with local Veterans Service Officer, possibly M-Show Group who helps the elderly. Will collect ideas, and decide before September Ripples of Faith deadline.

Parades

Circle of Faith will be marching in both the Trimont (7/12/14) and Welcome (7/19/14) parades. We will be wearing our new matching t-shirts, handing out freeze pops and cards with COF information and photo on them. This is to raise awareness of our new Parish within our communities.

Parade Handouts

The Communications Team passed out sample parade handouts, which included our logo, parish group photo, and new motto on the front, and a list of the three congregations, with addresses and worship times, and parish office contact information on the back. These will be handed out, along with freeze pops, at parades in Trimont (July 12th) and Welcome (July 19th). Jon Saxen suggested adding "Parish photo taken on February 23, 2014, when ELCA Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton visited Circle of Faith Parish." This will be included on the 2nd printing of these handouts, for the Welcome parade.

School Kits:

- *4—70 sheet notebooks (280-300) sheets total) of wide—or college-ruled paper approximately 8" x 10 1/2", no loose-leaf paper
- *1-30 centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other.
- *1—pencil sharpener
- *1-pair of blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- *5—unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band
- *5—black or blue ball point pens (no gel pens); secure together with a rubber band
- *1-box of 16 or 24 crayons
- *1-2 1/2" eraser

HYMN OF THE MONTH (August)

I have written about this hymn before but I like the story, we all know the hymn, everyone loves the hymn, it is a favorite of children everywhere and Sunday School will soon be starting up again (where did the summer go?) At any rate, I would like to repeat this story:

Anna and Susan Warner lived in a lovely town house in New York City where their father was a successful lawyer. When the panic of 1837 wrecked their finances they were forced to move into a Revolution War-era home on the Hudson River directly across from West Point Military Academy. In order to help with family's finances the girls began writing novels and poetry. One of their most successful novels was "Say and Seal", about a young man named Johnny Fox who is dying. In the story the boy's Sunday school teacher comforts him by holding him in his arms and saying the poem, "Jesus loves me, this I know, for the Bible tells me so..." The novel became a best seller, second only to "Uncle Tom's Cabin". In 1861, William Bradbury (composer of many hymns including "Sweet Hour of Prayer", "Just As I Am", and "He Leadeth Me") set the poem to music and added the refrain. It is now the most popular children's hymn around the world. It is among the first taught by missionaries in the mission field and usually the first taught in our Sunday Schools.

When Anna and Susan Warner moved near West Point they began a Sunday School class for the cadets and continued the class for forty years. When they died they were buried with full military honors in recognition of their spiritual contributions to the lives of the young cadets – the only civilians ever to be buried in the military cemetery at West Point. The Warner family bequeathed their home to the academy and it has been turned into a museum to their memory. This definitely affirms the adage, "Bloom Where You Are Planted!!"


