PASTOR ANTHONY'S RIPPLES

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

Back in September, I went to LutherCrest Bible Camp (near Alexandria) for our synod's annual Fall Theological Conference for Pastors. The conference began at 9:00 am on a Monday and I could have drove up Sunday afternoon, but in order to spend more time with my family, I chose to make the $3\frac{1}{2}$ hour drive early Monday morning. It was dark when I began my journey northward. As I was driving north on highway 4, the horizon began to change colors. To my right, I could see the light from the sun was beginning to show. To my left, I could see the darkness getting pushed away.

In John's Gospel it says, "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it." (John 1:5) From the east, you can see the sun rising and as it does, it pushes the darkness away. When the light is present, the darkness cannot overcome it. No matter how much it tries, the darkness from the previous night will not be able to overcome the dawn of the new day. So too, Jesus (the light of the world) pushes our darkness away. Jesus makes it impossible for the evil darkness to overtake us. Just as there are shadows present throughout the day, we too will have moments of darkness in our lives. But these moments of darkness will not be able to overtake us as long as we have Christ on our side.

Advent is nearly here, which means that periods of darkness get longer, but our altar cloths turn to blue as we wait in hope of Christ's return. When Christ does return in glory, the darkness of this world will fully come to an end. Until then, we light candles in anticipation of Christ's return. On Christmas Eve, we will proclaim these words from John's Gospel in hope that one day the promise will be fulfilled, "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it."

As we enter the Advent and Christmas season, we REJOICE in the Lord. Those first Christians from Acts 2 were "praising God and having the goodwill of all people." (Acts 2:47) Advent and Christmas are seasons of the church year where we especially REJOICE for all that the Lord has and will do for us. We have already been claimed as a child of God, been given the gift of the Holy Spirit and the forgiveness of sins, and we wait in anticipation for the return of our savior – the one who shines in the darkness, and the darkness cannot overcome him! REJOICE in the Lord, for one day Christ will come again! Until then, we light our candles as we wait and hope.

Reminder: Christmas Eve Candlelight services begin at 5:00 pm at Trinity & Waverly, 6:30 pm at St. Peter.

PASTOR ERIC'S RIPPLES

Dear fellow rejoicers,

We continue our emphasis on the theme, "What we do as Jesus' followers." We are looking at what the early Christians did from Acts 2. We focused on "sharing" because they shared. Now we focus on "rejoice", because they rejoiced. Here is the NIV translation, "They ... ate together with glad and sincere hearts, praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people." (Acts 2:46 - 47)

I see some happy people in these verses. It seems like they were enjoying their time with one another as they praised God and shared the good news of Jesus. Their hearts were glad. When do you experience a glad heart? My Norwegian heritage allows me to experience a heart that fluctuates from the one extreme of "not too bad" all the way to the other extreme of "pretty good". And, my heart feels "pretty good" on Sunday morning when I come to worship with you. Each of our Circle of Faith congregations has a kind of joy in it's fellowship. People smile, people care for one another. Why? I think it is because like the early Christians we too gather to celebrate the great good news of Jesus. Jesus is right smack dab in the middle of it all. From our songs, to our readings, to our prayers, to our sharing, to our coffee to our connections outside of church.

Many of us have had the joy of the good news of Jesus since our baptism at a very young age and so we may sometimes take it a little bit for granted. We plod along in the routines of church chores and life chores and forget the extraordinary blessings of Jesus. This month we are reminded to rejoice. I hope it won't be too much of a struggle. Remember how all the angels in heaven rejoiced when one lost sheep was found and how they rejoiced with the shepherds when Jesus was born. We do that too. It is important. Your rejoicing does a great deal for me and I know it does for others as well.

"Rejoice in the Lord always, again I say rejoice. Let your gentleness be known to all. The Lord is near." (Philippians 4:4-5)

Pr. Anthony led devotions - "What We Do", based on Acts 2:41-47.

Kirsten Rabbe presented the Secretary's report for the October 1, 2014 Parish Council meeting. Motion by Jon Helvig, seconded by Liz Stahl, to approve the Secretary's report as presented. Motion passed.

Joel Rabbe presented the October 2014 Operating Statement. Motion by Jon Saxen, seconded by Merle Burmeister, to approve the Treasurer's report as presented. Liz Stahl would like to look into service contract options. Pr. Anthony will have the administrators look into options. Motion passed.\

A Seminarian's Letters Home

December 2014

To the membership of Circle of Faith Parish:

Greetings to you all from Evanston, IL! As I write this, we are all shivering here on the shores of Lake Michigan – that icy blast of polar air hit us full on. The snow has not yet come to stay, but winter's cold bites deeply already. It's a crazy time to focus on the word REJOICE, isn't it? Everything is cold and lifeless, the days turn pitch black very quickly, and all we have to hold off the dark of the year are the tiny lights of Advent candles.

This month at Circle of Faith, we'll be having a parish party to celebrate St. Nicholas of Myra, whom we know better as Santa Claus. He was a Turkish bishop who was famous for his devotion to the poor. The legend is that he learned of a congregant who was going to have to sell his three daughters as slaves, because he could not provide for them. Nicholas came by the house in the dead of night and threw bags of gold coins into the chimney. One of the daughters had hung socks by the fire to dry out after washing them, and the purses of gold happened to fall into them. That's where the tradition of hanging Christmas stockings comes from. With that money, the father could ensure his children's future.

No, in case you are wondering, our own bishop won't be throwing bags of treasure down our chimneys on Christmas Eve. But Advent is the time for unexpected treasures to show up among us. After all, who would expect that God would appear as a human being, born the homeless child of an unwed mother? Who would expect that child would grow up to save us all, and promise to return? And who would expect that people who bear the name Christian would be singing constantly, lighting candles, blessing water, and all the other fun things we do on the darkest, coldest nights of the year, celebrating our hope at the time when everything seems completely devoid of hope? But that's what Advent is all about, the time for singing our prayer that Immanuel come, and joyfully trusting that the Word made flesh has already come, and will come again.

Praying through the dark and cold by Advent's candlelight, let us pray for God's blessing, using these words:

Stir up your power, Lord Christ, and come. With your abundant grace and might, free us from the sin that would obstruct your mercy, that willingly we may bear your redeeming love to all the world, for you live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen. [ELW, Advent IV]

The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

Our sympathy to the Onken family in their loss of Shirley.





Christina Rossetti came from a remarkable family. Her father was a political refugee from Italy and became a professor of Italian at Oxford. Christina, her sister and two brothers all became writers. The third brother was an artist. Christina was a poet and often compared to Elizabeth Barrett Browning. Although she was engaged several times she never married because of her strong religious principles which she would not compromise.

"In the Bleak Midwinter" is a Christmas song based on a poem written by Christina before 1872. It wasn't published until after her death in 1904. It became a Christmas carol in1906 when it was paired with music by Gustav Holst. Both the lyrics and the music are simple and easy to understand. In the carol Rossetti tries to portray the birth of Jesus in Bethlehem, contrasting the first and second coming. She also describes the angels present at His birth, and the physical affection that Mary is able to display with a mother's kiss. And in the last verse she says: "What can I give Him, poor as I am? If I were a shepherd, I would bring a lamb; if I were a wise man I would do my part; yet what can I give Him? Give my heart." Simplicity at its best.
