

Parish Council Meeting Minutes January 12, 2016

Congregational Presidents present: Jody Franck from St. Peter, Henry Borchardt from Trinity, Nancy Nordstrom from Waverly.

Motion by Jon Saxen, seconded by Jody Franck, to approve the agenda as presented. Motion passed.

We began the meeting with the Lord's Prayer.

Pr. Anthony led us in devotions. What is God calling this parish to be and do in the future? What changes are in order to help us respond to that call faithfully? Pastor read Matthew 28:16-20 – The Great Commission. Council discussed the questions Pastor posed.

The Secretary's report for the December 8, 2015 Parish Council meeting was presented. Motion by Jon Saxen, seconded by Karen Helvig, to approve the Secretary's report as amended (one year change). Motion passed.

Jon Saxen presented the December 2016 Operating Statement. Jon also explained the 12 months ended 12/31/2015, and budgeted vs. actual for 2015. Motion by Merle Burmeister, seconded by Jody Franck, to approve the operating statements for December 2015 and Calendar year 2015 as presented. Motion passed.

- . Equipping congregations day Saturday Feb. 20, 8:30-3:30 pm. \$150/parish or \$25/person. Dwight Shyley prof at Luther will be keynote speaker. It's a great day! Let Pastor know if you want to go.

Insurance update

Jon Saxen explained that with our renewal, Cyber liability and data breach liability were added for the first time this

year. Circle of Faith chose to waive that coverage, as we store no data personal data online. This offers us an approximate \$175 savings. Trinity also waived it in their policy. Henry suggested that St. Peter and Waverly also look into this savings as well.

A motion by Sue and seconded by Bob to approve the agenda with the addition of finalizing the agenda for the annual meeting, and Equipping Congregations meeting in Willmar. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report: Cliff reported we received \$5,903.15 over budget! Cliff suggested we pay the church insurance yearly rather than monthly to save some money. A motion by Karen and seconded by Tom to approve the Treasurer's Report. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report: The High School youth group decided to plan a trip for the summer of 2017 instead of this year so they could raise more money. The Honeywell Alert System has already been tested. Instructions on how to sign up were printed in the Ripples and are also on the church web page. The youth will be having a Lock-In at Waverly church January 22 to 23rd. If members would like to help with that you can call Past Anthony. Equipping Congregations will be held Sat February 20th in Willmar. There will be 30 different workshops. Members attending will be able to choose three workshops they would want to attend during the day. There were over 900 church members that attended last year. February 10th is Ash Wednesday. This service will be at St. Peter's at 7:00 pm. Churches will be rotating the Lenten services with a meal before. Lenten Eve services at Waverly are February 17, and March 8th.

Worship Committee: Church assistant schedule is complete and sent to members. One acolyte has completed the training. A few more students are in the process of training.

Caring Ministry: The committee has given communion to our members in the Health Care Facilities. The committee will be delivering Meals on Wheels in Trimont for two weeks starting Jan 18th. If any member would like to help you can call Tom Peterson.

Faith Formation: No Report We would like to thank Will and Sara Hecht, Todd and Susan Rathman for all the work they did for the wonderful Christmas program. Sunday school teachers are still needed for March, April, and May.

Property Committee: Nativity Scene had been taken down. A new vacuum cleaner has been purchased. The Louvers for the bell tower have not been replaced yet. Ice melt is by the West door if needed in this cold weather. Marleone will check into paying the domain fees for the internet by check instead of someone charging this on their credit card.

The nominating committee has nominated members for all vacant positions except for Vice president. This will be presented at the church meeting to see if there are any volunteers for that position.

New Business: Cliff and some members from our church attended a meeting last week with Amy Bigot from The ELCA church Endowment Fund. This information will be presented at our annual meeting. After receiving more information our church can decide if we would like to invest in this program.

Belva met with Karen Helvig and Kirsten Rabbe about Harvest Homecoming. They are gathering information to put together in a binder, what is needed for the day and people to contact to help make the day successful, such as food, tents, animals etc. We will be communicating with our members and Gloria Dei early in the summer. 



HYMN OF THE MONTH - February

"O, Master, Let Me Walk With Thee". Washington Glidden was the creator of this hymn. He was a newspaper man who became a clergyman. His great-grandfather had been a body guard for George Washington during the Revolutionary War. Glidden had always been interested in social and political situations and fought hard, both through newspapers and from the pulpit. He fought against New York politics. He objected to John Rockefeller's gifts to his denominations mission board because of his policies at Standard Oil. He tried to encourage his congregations and make them aware of social and labor problems in the country. He would be thought of today as a social activist – he did not approve the efforts of evangelists like Billy Sunday. He believed in evolution – saying the Bible was not correct scientifically of historically.

Glidden wrote this hymn in 1879, saying it was an honest cry of human need and the need for divine companionship. "If our friendship with Jesus does not lead us to concern for others in every way possible, including spiritually, then we should check to see how closely we are walking with the Master." In spite of some of his radical views, Christians of all kinds have embraced this hymn as their own while working for the Master. "In hope that sends a shining ray far down the future's broad'ning way, In peace that only Thou canst give, with Thee, O Master, let me live.
