PASTOR ANTHONY'S RIPPLES

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

With the typical decline in worship attendance during the summer months, I thought it might be helpful to share with you why going to church every week is important to me (and not just because it is my job). I grew up going to church every week without really knowing why we went. It was just what we did. Now today, many young people (and even older people) are so busy that they have to prioritize life, and things that don't appear important get cut.

Let me ask you, what really matters when it comes to worship? Is it the start time, the day of the week, where you sit, or the type of music that is played? Or is it about Jesus and coming to hear the Word of God? Christian worship is not about making us feel good or satisfying our desire to hear a good hymn...it is all about Jesus. We come each week to worship to be reminded (because it is easy to forget) about the hope that we have through Jesus. Through Jesus (and the waters of baptism), we are promised that this life is not all there is – that even though we die, we will live. We have hope! We have a future with God! We also receive full and complete forgiveness of all of our sins when we come to worship. Guilt is a terrible thing to carry with us and when someone actually says that they forgive us, the guilt that we carry is finally removed. You can only carry so much guilt in your life until it becomes too burdensome to carry on. So we gather for worship to receive God's forgiveness through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. We do so by following his commandment to eat and drink. When we eat and drink we physically receive God's forgiveness and love; both of which are unconditional.

If someone sits in your pew, who cares. If the worship time gets changed at your church, who cares. If you worship on another day of the week, who cares. As long as you are hearing God's Word proclaimed about the hope we having in Christ Jesus, and you are receiving God's forgiveness through the sacrament of his body and blood, then it doesn't matter when you worship, as long as you are worshipping. In the coming weeks, we will be talking more about the importance of worshipping and receiving communion. Until then, blessings to you in the days and weeks ahead as we enjoy the summer weather that God has given us!

Staff present: Pastor Anthony Christoffels, Pr. Eric Midthun. Congregational Presidents present: Jody Franck from St. Peter.

Motion by Jon Saxen, seconded by Karen Helvig, to approve the agenda as amended. Motion passed.

Pr. Anthony led us in prayer.

The Secretary's report for the May 12, 2015 Parish Council meeting was presented. Motion by Merle Burmeister, seconded by Jody Franck, to approve the Secretary's report as changed. Motion passed.

Jon Saxen presented the May 2015 Operating Statement to the Parish Council. Motion by Kirsten Rabbe, seconded by Karen Helvig, to approve the Treasurer's report as presented. Motion passed.

REPORTS

Pastor Anthony Christoffels report

- . Synod Assembly this weekend, please hold all synod delegates in prayer, as we discern and elect a bishop for the next 6 years, whether it be our current bishop or a new one.
- . Mission on the Prairie tonight's was a success. 54 people came to worship, ate together, and heard Carl Rabbe talk about Mission & Liturgy. Next: July 1st, Rev. Larry Strenge, ELCA Synod Minister for Mission (Trinity responsible for the meal), then August 14th, Rev. Dr. Alan Luedtke from Luther Seminary (St. Peter responsible for the meal).
- . Remember Flat Jesus, take pictures and get them to Pr. Anthony. St. Peter has submitted a picture from Spicer, MN.
- . On June 11th, the MCW Backpack program meeting, 3 pm at First Lutheran in Trimont, will have a better idea on the need and funding. More details next month as we discuss our upcoming "God's Work, Our Hand's" Sunday in September.
- . On June 11th at Waverly, we are hosting the Bishop of South African Diocese. Pot luck meal at 6:30 pm.
- . Pr. Anthony's last vacation July 30 August 7th. (August 2nd). St. Peter or Waverly. Steve requested all vacation days in one spot, sent to the council.

Committee Updates

Communications Team: Parades: Trimont July 11th, Welcome July 18th. Vinyl, reusable signs are being ordered. Website design: a template has been chosen. Work will begin when we have an intern in place. Meal project. A friend of Karen Helvig's, who sits on the national insurance board, talked to the legal staff for Farmers Mutual Insurance, regarding liability and coverage for Circle of Faith if we proceed with the Meal Project. Their belief is that our liability would be exactly the same as if we had any other church function.

Wedding/Funeral Committee: Met for the first time on June 8th. Policies for weddings and funerals have been reviewed by the committee (all three congregations represented). Changes will be made. These will be presented to the congregational councils at their July meetings, then to the Parish Council at their August meeting.

Administrative Committee: Current Parish Agreement will be emailed to the Admin committee for review. We can then decide if we need to meet before fall to consider any revisions.

Discussed what to do if a congregation cannot find people to serve. While the Parish Agreement states that members cannot serve beyond their term limits, it also states that we cannot have a quorum (conduct business) unless each congregation is represented on the Parish Council. The Administrative Committee will consider this when looking at the Parish Agreement. Talked about other ways of educating and recruiting people. We will keep this on the agenda each month moving forward.

St. Peter will hold a pancake breakfast on Sunday, June 14th, 10 am – 12:30 pm as a fundraiser for the church that we are helping build in South Africa.

The next Circle of Faith Parish Council meeting will be July 14, 2015, 6:00 pm, at St. Peter in Ceylon, as VBS is being held at Trinity. Motion by Jon Saxen, seconded by Jody Franck, to adjourn the meeting at 8:35 pm. Motion passed.

On vocation? Use GPS

Many vacationer rely on a global positioning system to get them easily to a destination. But in every season of life, God sends us on *vocation*— following his call to both feed our passions and serve others. Our "calling" Frederick Buechner said, is "where [our] deep gladness and the world's deep hunger meet".



But is there a GPS for *vocation*? It's not as detailed or predictive as we'd like. It doesn't name our destination at the outset, and it offers general instructions rather than specific directions. And we may end up "recalculating" our life route more often than our life vehicle GPS recalculates our vacation route.

Even so, we travel in safety. This "GPS" might stand for *God's Peace and Strength*, or *Gospel Promises Sustain*, *God Provides Salvation* or *Go! Proclaim! Serve!*The GPS providing our vocation speaks to us through Scripture, worship, trusted Christian friends, life events and the silence of our heart. Listening, we hear our Guide's calm voice and continue on vocation.

A Seminarian's Letters Home

To the membership of Circle of Faith Parish:

Greetings to you all from Evanston, IL! First of all, thanks to everyone who came and participated in launching the Mission on the Prairie series! To get 54 people, from churches all over the area, to come for Holden Evening Prayer and a meal on a summer weeknight is no small task. Thanks to everybody who worked to get us off to such a great start! Keep coming – there is more and better stuff to come throughout the summer! Best of all, the food is excellent, and it's free!

Circle of Faith is trying something else very exciting this summer that involves free food. During late July and August, while the lectionary takes us through a long series of Jesus' discourses where he calls himself the bread of life, we'll be celebrating Holy Communion every Sunday. That's new to many of us, but there's a good reason for doing it.

A while ago, I was complaining to one of my friends that there was no good news in the lectionary readings for a certain Sunday. My training in hospital chaplaincy taught me to always make sure people left church having heard some good news in case it was the last they ever heard. She asked me if there was going to be Communion at that service. I said yes, there was. She said, "Then don't worry about it too much. They'll still hear the words 'given and shed *for you*.' If that's not good news, I don't know what is."

We'll celebrate Holy Communion every Sunday for those few weeks while we spend time with John's Gospel. Absolutely we'll hear good news when those discourses are read and our pastors preach on them. But then we'll get that good news placed right in our hands, and we'll get to go out and let that food and drink fuel what we learn about at Mission on the Prairie. And, best of all, this food, just like the food on those Wednesday nights, is free!

Heading on through a summer of learning, praying, singing and celebrating, we pray for God's blessing, using these words:

O God, our life, our strength, our food, we give you thanks for sustaining us with the body and blood of your Son. By your Holy Spirit, enliven us to be his body in the world, that more and more we will give you praise and serve your earth and its many peoples, through Jesus Christ our Savior and Lord. Amen. [ELW, Prayer After Communion]



"Let Us Break Bread Together" was reportedly a password message used to call slaves to secret, forbidden meetings in Virginia. It was a way to call them to worship with each other and to God. Today it is a call to all Christians to worship at the communion table together. Whether we kneel, sit or stand to receive communion does not matter. What matters is our attitude as we come before God to take part in this dinner. We commune not only with God but with each other. The "rising sun" mentioned in each verse is probably a reference to an ancient practice of worshipping while facing east. In Malachi chapter 4 it refers to the "Sun of Righteousness will rise with healing in his wings." That was considered a reference to the second coming of Christ. "As I fall on my knees with my face to the rising sun, oh, Lord, Have Mercy On Me"!
