Seminarian's Letter Home—March 2016

To the membership of Circle of Faith Parish:

Greetings to you all from Evanston, IL! As I write this letter, it's in the 40s outside, where snow is melting and clouds are hanging over the city. At this time of year, I always look outside and think, "Spring? Is that you?" But we're still in Lent, still in March, a month that has to come in like a lion in order to go out like a lamb. Circle of Faith has seen reminders that we are still in winter's grip over the past couple weeks, when so many funerals have taken place over o short a period of time. We're still waiting for spring, and for Easter. That's where we get the idea of keeping vigil, as we will on the night before Easter for the second year in a row.

Vigil is a word we often use when we're waiting for something to happen. Think about waiting for a relative or a friend to get to your house when you have not seen them in a long time, or when you're waiting to see if you can still cook your grandmother's classic foods as well as she could. During that time, as we wait, we tell stories – that's why we read so many biblical readings during the Easter Vigil. We also use that time to hand things on, which is why we either baptize new Christians on that night, or remember our own baptism, recalling how God acted to make us part of the story that began in the darkness of creation's first morning. We go out from the Vigil of Easter reminded of who and whose we are, and we go out to share the Easter feast with others. That just might be worth a few extra hours during Holy Week, eh?

Moving toward the week when we walk with Christ through that space between death and life, let us pray for God's blessing, using these words:

Eternal giver of light and life, this holy night shines with the radiance of the risen Christ. Renew your church in the Spirit given us in baptism, that we may worship you in sincerity and truth, and may shine as a light in the world, through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen. [ELW, Vigil of Easter]

The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

The turkey dinner date was set for April 24. Becky Detert will be in charge.

The thermostats in the church were discussed. The timer in the nursery room is not working. The timers get turned the wrong direction so they don't work. Bob will check into digital timers instead of the ones that we have.

The Eternal Light was discussed. A case of 24 candles costs \$87.34 and the light goes through one candle a week.

A motion to adjourn was made by Bob, seconded by Velma. Motion carried.

The next meeting will be April 12, 2016 at 7:30.

We closed with the Lord's Prayer.

Property Committee: They will be waiting till warmer weather to replace the louvers for the bell tower. Some faithful members continue to remove the snow around the church. Thank You!







Appropriate during the season of Lent is the dirge–like hymn, "O Sacred Head Now Wounded", written in 1153 by Monk Bernard of Clairvoux. He was born into a knight's family and educated as an aristocrat, but felt the call to monastic ministry. He arrived at Citeaux Monastery with thirty other men he had convinced to join. In three years he founded his own monastery at Clairvaux and stayed there his entire life. He was a brilliant man and was asked to advise both kings and popes. Historian H. O. J. Brown wrote, "The ability of one man without political offices to change history solely by his teaching is without parallel until Martin Luther would transform Europe from his pulpit and professor's chair in Saxony." Bernard helped preserve the doctrine of the Trinity but also supported Christian militarism such as the Knights Templar who fought to preserve European Christianity. He advocated using both sword and spirit.

The words of "O Sacred Head" urge us to look at the cross until we are overwhelmed by the depth of God's love for us. Imagine hearing it being sung by several monks as they walk down the halls of their monastery - - - -.
