Ripples of Faith

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

"Saved by Grace, Gathered in Faith, Called to Serve." Where have you seen/heard that phrase before? Hopefully you said that is the mission statement for Circle of Faith. It is also the words that circle the cross in our Circle of Faith logo. Have you ever stopped to think about these three short phrases?

Saved by Grace

This line is first in our mission statement because, we are first and foremost saved by grace through the waters of our baptisms. We were saved before we could do anything to earn it. Grace simply means a free gift from God. Our salvation, the eternal life that is promised to us is freely given not because of anything that we have or have not done, but all because of what God has done through Jesus Christ in his crucifixion, death and resurrection. On Sunday, October 4 the Gospel text from Mark 10:2-16 shows us exactly this grace. Jesus brings the little children to himself and says, "Whoever does not receive the kingdom of God as a little child will never enter it." It is through the faith of child that grace comes pouring in.

Gathered in Faith

This life is not always easy, and many of you know this all too well. From cancer and heart attacks, to accidents and alcohol/drug abuse – this life is challenging, difficult and feels nearly impossible at times. Even though we know that we have been saved by grace and carry with us the promises of the resurrection, we still often forget about these promises and try to face this challenging life alone. This is why we *Gathering in Faith*. We gather with other believers, centered around God's Word at the weekly worship services, around the altar for Holy Communion, during Bible studies, and around the coffee table for socializing, support for one another and to grow in our relationships with each other and with God. On Sunday, October 11 the Gospel text from Mark 10:17-31 reminds us that one our own, it is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for someone who is rich to enter the kingdom of God. For us, on our own, it is impossible to save ourselves and get into heaven, but for God, all things are possible. This is why we gather in faith, to support each other, pray for each other, and grow with each other.

Called to Serve

First we are saved by grace, not by any doing of our own. We then gather together in faith to be given the strength that we need to continue each week in this life. Then and only then are we able to do as Jesus commanded us, which was to go and serve our neighbors. As disciples of Jesus, members of God family, the body of Christ, we are called to serve others in Christ's name. On Sunday, October 18 the Gospel text from Mark 10:35-45 gives us an example of what service in Christ's name really looks like. It is not arguing amongst ourselves on who is the greatest, but rather following Jesus' example that to be considered great means to actually be a servant to all.

And there you have it. We are Saved by Grace, Gathered in Faith, Called to Serve! I challenge you to continually working on all three of these:

- Saved by Grace: When you wake up in the morning, with your figure trace a cross on your forehead to remind yourself that you have been saved by God' grace.
- Gathered in Faith: Keep church as a priority in your life and in the life of your family. Gathering together in faith is key to our relationships with each other and with God.
- Called to Serve: In your service to one another, do so with the intent of helping a fellow brother or sister in Christ, not to simply make yourself feel good or meet a requirement.

Circle of Faith, you have been SAVED BY GRACE so that you can be GATHERED IN FAITH in order that you listen to God in which you are CALLED TO SERVE.

Seminarian's Letters Home October 2015

To the membership of Circle of Faith Parish:

Greetings to you all from Evanston, IL! Welcome to another season of changing leaves, harvesting crops, hunting season, cooler days and longer nights! We are now officially in the fall of the year, and are preparing, as we always do, to celebrate Reformation at the end of October. Meanwhile, of course, it's harvest time.

On October 17, the Church remembers a saint named John the Dwarf. He had a funny name, and a funny story. In the late fourth century, he went to the Egyptian desert to become a monk. His mentor felt that he needed to learn patience and persistence, so he stuck a stick in the ground, and instructed John to water it every day until it bore fruit. John thought it was ridiculous, but kept on watering it every single day for three years straight, until a seed concealed within the stick finally sprouted and grew into an apple tree.

Funny how that kind of thing happens in Christian life, isn't it? John the Dwarf couldn't have known what would happen as he kept on watering that stick. Luther could never have known when he nailed the 95 Theses to a door that his ideas would fuel one of the most powerful movements in Western Christianity. Our ancestors could not know, when they set up our three churches, that in time we would grow to become the area parish we have. All they had, and all we have, is faith, and the promise that God can and will do something with even our simple lives, and with such basic stuff as a book, a bowl of water, a piece of bread and a glass of wine. But that's the point of Reformation, after all – that God makes amazing things happen in the last place on earth we'd think to look.

Heading through harvest toward Reformation and the feasts of the saints, let us pray for God's blessing, using these words:

Almighty God, gracious Lord, we thank you that your Holy Spirit renews the church in every age. Pour out your Holy Spirit upon your faithful people. Keep them steadfast in your word, comfort and protect them in times of trial, defend them from all enemies of the Gospel, and bestow upon your church your saving peace, through Jesus Christ our Savior and Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen. [ELW, Reformation Sunday]

The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all.



This hymn was studied about and reported to you six years ago but I wanted to do it again for this thanksgiving season. In spite of the situations occurring around the world there is still much to be thankful for. Martin Rinkhart (1586-1649) was a Lutheran minister serving in the village of Eilenberg, Saxony during thirty years war and when the bubonic plague was ravaging all of Europe. Eilenberg was under siege and death was rampant. Since Martin was the only minister left in town, he performed as many as 40 to 50 funerals a day. By 1637 he had performed 4,480 funerals including that of his wife. At the end of the war Sweden and Austria asked him to be in on the final negotiations to end the war. Negotiations were very difficult, but the war finally ended, Martin felt that there would be no peace without some type of thanksgiving. He had been a prolific hymn writer all his life but "Now Thank We All Our God" was to be his best. It is sung all over the world. In Germany it is considered second only to Martin Luther's "A Might Fortress". The first verse is an expression of gratitude to God. The second is asking for God's continual care and keeping. The final is a doxology of praise to the 'one eternal god'. After all they had been through with war and pestilence they still could thank God. We must be aware of this as well - no matter what life brings we must still say, "NOW THANK WE ALL OUR GOD, WITH HEARTS AND HANDS AND VOICES." And we will know that 'God will be with us in this world and the next.'
