#### PASTOR ANTHONY'S RIPPLES

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

With September quickly approaching on the calendar, it is that time of year again where we begin a new program year. Last year, in our infancy as a parish, we worked on answering the question, "Who are we?" We did this by working through 1 Peter 2:9.

"...you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, in order that you may proclaim the mighty acts of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light."

What we learned through this verse is that we have been chosen by God through our baptism for a purpose, and that purpose is to proclaim God's mighty acts. Now this year, we will explore the question, "What are we doing?" along with "What should we be doing?" We again will work through this question in our monthly newsletters and weekly worship services. But this year we will also be having a few special events through the year.

To help guide us through our year, we will be looking at Acts 2:41-47.

"So those who welcomed his message were baptized, and that day about three thousand persons were added. They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. Awe came upon everyone, because many wonders and signs were being done by the apostles. All who believed were together and had all things in common; they would sell their possessions and goods and distribute the proceeds to all, as any had need. Day by day, as they spent much time together in the temple, they broke bread at home and ate their food with glad and generous hearts, praising God and having the goodwill of all the people. And day by day the Lord added to their number those who were being saved."

As we move through this year, there are 5 words or themes that we will focus on from Acts 2. These 5 words are: SHARE, REJOICE, FELLOWSHIP, PRAY, and WORSHIP. There will be a special event tied to each word as we go throughout the year. We begin this fall with the word SHARE. More details on our word SHARE in the coming weeks, but our special event tied to the word SHARE is our *God's Work, Our Hands Sunday* projects. Some of us are doing our service projects on September 7<sup>th</sup>. While others are waiting and doing their projects later this fall. Details on each congregation's projects are listed in this issue of *Ripple of Faith*.

Baptized children of God, will you join us this year as we Share with others, Rejoice in the Lord, Fellowship together, Pray to God, and Worship the Lord?

#### PASTOR ERIC'S RIPPLES

Dear friends,

We are thinking about the question of what we <u>do</u> as God's people.

I remember a few weeks after one of our children had been confirmed he was not ready to go to church on Sunday morning. We called for him and eventually he showed up and said that he was now an adult Christian who could make his own decisions and had decided that he was not going to go to church that day. We (his parents) told him he had to but he said it was not fair that just because he was the pastor's kid he had to go to church. Then we said he was not going to church because he was a pastors kid, but because we were a Christian family and that is one of the things that Christian families do. What do you do because you are a Christian or a Christian family? There are many answers to that question and they depend on what sort of a person you are and what your situation is and what you have and what God has put in your heart.

There was an old bachelor who at age 90 moved off his farm and into an apartment. He was hardly ever at church and so I was surprised to hear this story. When he set up his new bedroom he had to have a dresser at the foot of his bed with a picture of Jesus on it. He said, "The last thing I want to see at night and the first thing I want to see in the morning is the one who died for me." That was one of the things he did because he was a Christian.

What do we <u>do</u> as God's people? It seems to me that thinking about this question is a helpful way to become more aware of how we live and how we make decisions and what motivates us and directs us. These five words can help us think about it...<u>share</u>, <u>rejoice</u>, <u>fellowship</u>, <u>pray</u>, <u>worship</u>.

May you catch a big fish or make a hole-in-one.

No Council meeting in August.

#### Semi Annual meeting minutes: Sunday August 10.

President Phil Burgess called the meeting to order at 11:20.

The minutes and reports were distributed to the congregation upon arrival at church. Phil requested we look over the agenda and reports for approval.

Jean Schock made a motion to approve the Annual Meeting minutes. John Frerichs seconded. Motion carried. Joel Detert made a motion to approve the Financial Secretaries report. Bob Swanson seconded. Motion carried. Steve Morrow made a motion to approve the Treasurers report. Jean Schock seconded. Discussion was held on the utilities budgeted amount verses already spent. The boiler working improperly was the result of the extra expense. Motion carried.

#### Old Business.

Pastor's window replacement.

We received two bids on replacing both windows. One was from Dan Peterson Construction for \$2,600 and Schmidt Siding & Window for \$2,420 (\$800 deposit). Eileen Morrow moved that we accept the Schmidt bid. Jean Schock seconded. Motion carried.

Waterline Update

The waterline has been installed in the basement. It has not been hooked up yet, but the tubing has been run between the outside of the church to the meter. The next step is to get it connected to the meter and disconnected from the house next door.

#### **New Business**

Boiler Update

The boiler in the basement has been causing problems and is over 23 years old. We received a quote from Day Plumbing for servicing, adding a new expansion tank and additional parts for \$1270.00. Bob Swanson moved to spend the money to repair the boiler. Janet Saxen seconded. Motion carried.

#### Communion Cards

The Synod doesn't require us to report the number of people communicating any longer and we as Trinity do not use this information for anything either so discussion was held on discontinuing them. Janet Saxen made a motion to not reorder the cards since they are costly. Liz Stahl made a amendment to the motion to also not keep track of communion participation any longer. Joel Detert seconded. Motion carried.

#### Constitutional Update

Discussion was help on the progress of the Constitution committee. Pastor filled us in on what changes we are looking at implementing and that it would be simpler to do a complete revision than it would be to do an update since we would have to vote on each individual item that we updated where as a revision would require one vote to update the whole Constitution.

Semi-Annual vs annual meeting and meeting time. Discussion was held on whether to continue to hold semi-annual meetings or have just an annual meeting and also what time of the year to hold them. If we would change our meeting date and our fiscal year, how would that work with the Circle of Faith fiscal year. No vote was taken on the discussion.

Council Spending Limit. Discussion was held on raising the dollar amount now set for exceeding budgeted and non budgeted items. Currently we can spend \$500 without Congregational approval for a non budgeted item and up to \$1000 without Congregational approval for additional expenses for a budgeted item. Such as a new water heater would take a special congregational meeting to approve. Don Saxen moved to approve raising the amounts to \$1,000

for a non-budgeted item and \$2,000 for extra expenses for a budgeted item. Connie Jensen seconded. Motion carried. Joel Detert moved to authorize the payment of utilities for the rest of the year since we are already at the budgeted amount set for the calendar year. Liz Stahl seconded. Motion carried.

Bob Swanson moved to adjourn. Jean Schock seconded. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 12:20 p.m. Respectfully submitted, Eileen Morrow, Secretary



The music for "Earth and All Stars" was written by David Johnson. He had severed as a professor and music department head at St. Olaf for a time. He taught in several universities, was an organist and choir director and has composed many hymn tunes.

Singing this song fills you with awe and brings to mind that we owe EVERYTHING to God and that we must all "Sing to the Lord a new song!"

What a great sendoff to open the school of 1914-1915.
